

Congressman Church Makes Appointments To Naval Academy

Congressman Ralph E. Church, 10th district, Illinois, has announced today that he has been called upon by the Navy department to make appointments to Annapolis. The 10th district will have two vacancies at the Naval academy for admission in 1944.

A vacancy at West Point for the 10th district is not scheduled to occur until 1945. Congressman Church stated, however, that although there is now no 1944 vacancy for West Point, there is always that possibility and that new legislation might provide for an additional West Point appointee for admission in 1944.

In order to give the young men interested in these appointments equal opportunity to qualify, Mr. Church announced that he would hold his annual competitive examination of all candidates under the auspices of the Civil Service commission on Saturday, August 21. He has arranged with the commission for the examination to be held at Chicago, Evanston and Waukegan.

All candidates must be actual residents of the 10th district, of sound physical health and good moral character. Those competing for the Annapolis appointment must be not less than 17 nor more than 21 on April 1, 1944, and those interested in the possible West Point appointment must be not less than 17 nor more than 21 on July 1, 1944.

Prosecute Gas Ration Violators

Criminal prosecutions for violation of gasoline rationing regulations instituted by OPA through April 30, 1943 totaled 509. Ninety-three cases involved operators of gasoline stations. The remaining 416 were actions against individuals ranging from private automobile owners and filling station attendants to criminal "rings" engaged in systematic theft and sale of stolen gasoline ration books and coupons.
