CHRISTIAN SCIENCE CHURCHES

"Life" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, July 18.

The Golden Text was, "Understanding is a wellspring of life unto him that hath it" (Proverbs 16: 22).

Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "These words spake Jesus, and lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, Father, the hour is come; glorify thy Son, that thy Son also may glorify thee: And this is life eternal, that they might know thee, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent" (John 17: 1,3).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "This is life eternal," says Jesus, "is, shall be; and then he defines everlasting life as a present knowledge of his Father and of himself, the knowledge of Love, Truth and Life. . . . The way is straight and narrow which leads to the understanding that God is the only Life. It is a warfare, with the flesh, in which we must conquer sin, sickness, and death, either here or hereafter, — certainly before we can reach the goal of Spirit, or life in God" (P. 410,324).
