Have the events of the last few days encouraged you to read more about the activities on our war fronts? Do you feel that you want to know more of the inside story? There is a fund of information in some of the more recent books on the war at the Highland Park Public Library.

THIRTY SECONDS OVER TOKIO, by Captain Ted Lawson, is one of the most exciting of the war books published this summer. It is a firsthand account of the famous Tokio raids and the hair raising experiences of the participants after they landed in China.

W. L. White's QUEENS DIE PROUDLY is another thrilling record of Pacific fighting. The mighty Flying Fortresses—those queens of the air who battled the enemy from the Philippines to the siege of Java against incredible odds—are the courageous proud heroines of this challenging story.

Nor has the European war theatre been neglected in the newer books at the Library. **COMBINED OPERATIONS** reveals the inside story of activities in modern warfare. It is the official account of the Commandos in such events as the parachute raids on Italy, the capture of Madagascar, and General Clark's historic North African rendezvous.

"Flying Officer X" writes of impatient days and nights of epic adventure as an officer in Britain's air force. His new book, **THERE'S SOMETHING IN THE AIR**, is a collection of 21 stories of the Boys in the R. A. F. who nightly drop their loads of death and destruction on Germany and Northern France.

In order to better understand our own position in this world conflict and in the post-war world, one would do well to read Walter Lippman's **U. S. FOREIGN POLICY**. Mr. Lippman explains, with proof, how necessary it is that the United States reaches an agreement now on a workable foreign policy.

These are just a few of the books on the current situation which are available at the Highland Park Public Library.
