Gouchos Tame Brahma Bulls At Hollywood Show

Known for its ferocious savagery, the Brahma bull, sacred to the people of India, will be a star of the rodeo and Hollywood thrill show at Soldier field, Sept. 5 and 6. A herd of these wild animals will be tamed, before the eyes of the spectators, by Argentine gouchos from the pampas. This is but one attraction in the spectacle which is sponsored by the Cook County council, veterans of Foreign Wars of the U. S.

The "Sky High Girl," perched atop a slender pole, 200 feet high will send shivers along the spine of any audience, as will Maureen, beautiful little lady who serves as a human projectile, being shot from a cannon that is placed in a balloon, high in mid-air. The Segrist troupe, working hundreds of feet up, without a net, will bring forth gasps as will the Fox Jitterbugs, a duo that performs their dance 150 feet in the air on a platform 36 inches square.

Northbrook Youth, Dennis Mangan, Killed By Hit-Run Driver

A coroner's jury decided Saturday that the death of Dennis Henry Mangan, 17, son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Mangan of Northbrook resulted from injuries received when he was either struck or thrown from a moving vehicle on Pfingsten road, south of the Lake County line, on Saturday.

Police Chief Donald Clavey of Northbrook found the unconscious youth sprawled out on the right side of the pavement. There were no tire marks near the body, and it was thought by police that the hit-and-run driver apparently did not see Mangan until the car had hit him.

The Mangan family formerly lived in Highland Park and Prairie View. They now live at 2131 Walter avenue, Northbrook.

Besides the parents, the boy is survived by a brother, Thomas Jr., who is in the army. Funeral services were held Tuesday morning from St. James church. Burial in All-Saints cemetery Des Plaines.
