- 2 cups sifted flour.
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- teaspoon salt 36 cup shortening
- 16 cup milk 8 apples
- 4 cup brown sugar
- 4 teaspoon nutmeg 14 cup cinnamon candies
- 2 tablespoons margarine or butter

Sift together flour, baking powder, and sale. Cut or rub in shortening. Add milk to make soft

dough. Turn out on lightly floured board and knead gently 12 minutes. Roll 1/8 inch thick. Cut into 4-inch squares. Peel and core apples and place one on each night, Dec. 6, are well informed square. Mix brown sugar, nutmeg, and cinnamon candies. Fill center of apple with sugar mixture and dot with margarine or butter. Pull the corners of the dough up over the apple and seal. Bake on ungreased baking sheet in moderate oven (375° F.) 30 to 40 minutes or until apples are done.


