NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION Park District of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 10th day of October, 1945, an election will be held in and for the Park District of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said District the following propositions:

1. Shall bonds of the Park District of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, be issued to the amount of \$122,000 for the purpose of paying for the acquisition of a tract of land consisting of approximately 12 acres located at the foot of and on the north side of Roger Williams Avenue extending West from Lake Michigan to the first ravine, and for the building, maintaining, improving and protecting of the same for park purposes and for the payment of expenses incident thereto.
2. Shall bonds of the Park District of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, be issued to the amount of \$26,000 for the purpose of building, maintaining, improving and protecting of parks and recreational areas now owned and operated by said Park District, consisting of the construction of a repair shop and storage building

for park equipment on the golf course of said district, the installation of a new water main and sprinkling system for the golf course, the improvement of Lincoln Park by the construction of additional shelter houses, backstops and the installation of additional lighting, and the construction of tennis courts in Sunset Woods Park and West Longview Park.

Said election shall be held in the four election precincts heretofore established for all elections in and for said Park District, the boundaries of each precinct and the polling place therefor being as follows:

First Precinct: All of that portion of the Park District of Highland Park which lies East of the Center line of the Easterly right of way of the Chicago and North Western Railway Company and Northwesterly of the center line of Beech Street, in said Park District of Highland Park.

Polling Place: Davis and Maurice Electric Shop
19 N. Sheridan Road

Second Precinct: All of that portion of the Park District of Highland Park which lies East of the Center line of the East Skokie Drainage Ditch and Southeasterly of a line described as follows: Beginning at the intersection of Beech Street and the shore of Lake Michigan, thence Southwesterly along Beech Street to the intersection of Beech Street and Ridgewood Drive, thence Southwesterly along Ridgewood Drive to the intersection of South Green Bay Road and Edgewood Road, (Edgewood Road being the North line of Section 25, Township 43 North, Range 12 East of the 3rd P. M.) thence West along the North line of Section 25, Township 43 North, Range 12 East of the 3rd P. M. to the point of intersection with the Center line of the East Skokie Drainage Ditch.

Polling Place: The Terraces
355 Roger Williams Avenue

Third Precinct: All of that portion of the Park District of Highland Park which lies East of the Center line of the East Skokie Drainage Ditch, and Southwesterly of the Center line of the Easterly right of way of the Chicago and North Western Railway Company, and Northwesterly of a line described as follows: Commencing at the intersection of Beech Street and the Center line of the Easterly right of way of the Chicago and North Western Railway Company, thence Southwesterly along Beech Street to the intersection of Beech Street and Ridgewood Drive, thence Southwesterly along Ridgewood Drive to the intersection of Ridgewood Drive and South Green Bay Road, thence Southeasterly along South Green Bay Road to the intersection of

South Green Bay Road and Edgewood Road, (Edgewood Road being the North line of Section 25, Township 43 North, Range 12 East of the 3rd P. M.) thence West along the North line of Section 25, Township 43 North, Range 12 East of the 3rd P. M. to the point of intersection with the Center line of the East Skokie Drainage Ditch.

Polling Place: The Community Center
649 Central Avenue.

Fourth Precinct: All of that portion of the Park District of Highland Park which lies West of the Center line of the East Skokie Drainage Ditch.

Polling Place: Highland Park Fuel Co.
