Special Meetings to Close on Sunday

The twelve-night special evangelistic meetings will be brought to a close Sunday night in the First United Evangelical church, South Green Bay road, according to announcement by the pastor, R. S. Wilson. These services have been held nightly at 7:45 by Evangelist G. E. Vinaroff, of Russel, Kans.

The speaker comes to Highland Park with a number of years experience in evangelistic work in churches of various denominations, and the meeting in the local church is non-sectarian and is open to everyone. Mr. Vinaroff is a graduate of Moody Bible Institute of Chicago (1914), and has been assisting churches since that time, except for a time of service in World War I. He is a contributor to national periodicals such as "Revelation" magazine, "Moody Monthly," and "The Religious Telescope." He is an ordained minister of the Kansas conference of the United Brethren denomination. He will tell the story of his life at a special service next Sunday afternoon at 2:30. There has been considerable speculation on the country where he was born, and up to the time this went to press, no one has been able to discover the name of his native land.

Special nights are being observed every evening this week, with Thursday night as Mother and Daughter night, the oldest and youngest mother receiving gifts. Friday night is Family night with the largest family present to be rewarded.

Saturday night will be another youth night. Sixty eight young people and boys and girls were present last Saturday evening to see his magic messages. Saturday, April 6, at 7:45 p.m., will be another service with magic and object lessons to present spiritual messages. Dishes will be given away in connection with this message. H will also reveal how the little doll went to the store and came back by itself last Saturday evening.

The Sunday school has set a goal for next Sunday of 171. Last Sunday morning 155 were present in the Sunday school session. Evangelist Vinaroff will speak at the morning worship service and also at the evening service in addition to the special afternoon service at 2:30. He will leave Monday to open a similar series of services in Piqua, Ohio, and later in Danville, Ill.

The purpose of these meetings is to help people get into right relationship with God, through Christ as Saviour. Visitors from other churches have been noted in the attendance at these meetings. On Easter Sunday, an opportunity will be given for members to unite with the church. On Palm Sunday, an opportunity for baptism will be provided.
