**Community Players To Present "The Guardsman" Aug. 24**

Building the sets and collecting the costumes are the immediate concern of the Highland Park Community Players as they prepare for their production of "The Guardsman." The famous Ferenc Molnar comedy will be presented Saturday, Aug. 24, at 8:30 in the high school auditorium.

Formerly the Skokie Players, the group is composed of local residents who stage plays in their spare time for the sheer pleasure of it. They are also earnest believers that the city needs and will support a resident amateur theater.

Their current production, "The Guardsman," is a romantic comedy concerning the test of fidelity of an actor husband on his actress wife. He fears her affections have wandered. She plays languid Chopin and day-dreams all day. Married for six months, the exact duration of her pre-marriage romances, the actor decides to dress up as a dashing foreign soldier and try to woo his own wife incognito. In this way he will either learn that she is not true or, if she recognizes him, that he is not as good an actor as he believed. The risk of one of these two crushing realities and the sparkling fun of the courtship make the play one of undeniable charm and wit. Molnar has made his classic comedy fast and very funny, and to the final curtain, and perhaps after, he sustains the quandary of the poor actor husband.
