Shortage of Manpower Cuts Girls' Chances

With a shortage of 1,000,000 marriageable males in the United States, between six and eight million American girls will have to go through life without a husband, according to the latest marital statistics.

Reduced to the figure that really means a lot to the average American girl, one girl in every seven will have to live alone whether she likes it or not, according to an article in a national magazine.

But there is a happy solution for girls with the marital urge who don't mind a spot of travel. Tops in the happy hunting grounds for husbands is Alaska, where it would be awfully difficult for a girl to miss catching a husband as there are 45 men to every girl.

Next most lush spots are Nevada, Wyoming, Idaho, California, Washington and Oregon.

Rhode Island is the toughest state in the country for husband-hunting, with Massachusetts, North Carolina, South Carolina and, in fact, most of Dixie close behind.

Cities which afford the best prospects for getting a husband are Gary, Ind., Detroit, Mich., or San Francisco.

Offer Child Management Course to High School

A course in home management was added to the home economics department during the summer vacation. Included in the new course is a nursery school, which already has five members, all between the ages of 2 and 5, who meet from 9:30 to 12 noon daily.

The nursery is in charge of Mrs. Rothenberger's classes, who wash, feed, and play with the children. Each week, the girls switch jobs in order that they all have a chance to act as hostess, cook, dietitian, home manager, housekeeper, and waitress.

Before the war, Mrs. Rothenberger, who was then Miss Deagorner, conducted a nursery school course in the old house behind the school. She has resumed the course because she feels that child management and care is an important part of a home economics education.

When the girls arrived back at school this fall, they found several changes in the home economics department. The walls in Mr. Pertz's room have been torn down, and a sewing room installed. The old sewing room is now the nursery, while Mr. Pertz has moved to the vocational building.

"Henry V" Now at Civic Theater, Chicago

A record for the motion picture roadshow for the middlewest looms for "Henry V" the spectacular all-technicolor production starring Laurence Olivier now in its second month at the Civic theater, Chicago.

Critical acclaim from the Chicago press equalled the extravagant praise accorded the film when it made its American bow in Boston five months ago where it continues to thrive. Its amazing success was similarly repeated in New York; Baltimore, Los Angeles and Detroit, so far the extent of engagements in the United States.

"Henry V" was 12 months in the making and is said to have cost more than \$4,000,000. A large portion of that time and money was spent in the reenactment of the famous battle of Agincourt which is the highlight of the film, described as a "photographed play." In order to make these scenes Olivier, who likewise produced and directed, took his entire cast and crew to southern Ireland. A camp was erected to accommodate more than a thousand persons. Sewage and drainage systems had to be installed. Fifty-eight houses and storerooms were constructed. For more efficient operation the camp adopted a military policy. A commanding officer was appointed who signed the permits to enter and leave, guards were posted and a strict routine invoked. Reveille was at 6 a.m. and the work day concluded at 6 p.m.

From the local labor exchange and Irish Home Guard 900 men were recruited to portray the English and French warriors of the 15th century. Before any shooting could begin they had to be trained in the art of medieval warfare. They were coached to use the long-bow and the crossbow, to throw lances and ride horses while heavily armored.

Prominent in Star Olivier's supporting cast are many members of London's celebrated Old Vic Players which won new laurels with its repertoire last season on Broadway.

Performances at the Civic are presented both matinee and evening every day, including Sunday.
