High School Boys Make Contribution to Hospital

A utility cabinet or bed rack, designed to hang on the back of a patient's hospital bed, has been the major project for the boys in vocational training this last year.

About two years ago Mrs. Edwin P. Keim, local chairman of the Junior Red Cross, asked Mr. Walter K. Durbahn, director of vocational training at the high school, if his classes would like to make some of the articles needed for Red Cross work. Mr. Durbahn selected a bed rack designed and developed by Col. Perkins and Gen. Carroll as the project for our school. This work came as a special opportunity because materials were scarce for other projects and the Red Cross would furnish all materials for this work.

The school promised to make 500 cabinets, made 360, and will complete their self-imposed assignment later in the year.

Remarks Aletta E. Horn, acting field director of the Red Cross at Vaughan General hospital:

"The bed racks, placed at the head of the bed, provide such an orderly arrangement for the patient's books, radio, comfort items, cigarettes, playing cards, stationery, etc., that he soon learns to reach back and find the article for which he has need with a minimum of effort.

"The installation of a bed rack eliminates the need for bedside tables, permitting more freedom for the corpsmen and nurses to make the bed and care for the patient's physical needs."

The two representatives from each class accompanying the first shipment to the hospital were received with cordiality, shown the entire hospital and reported with real enthusiasm the worth of their work and the pleasure they gave to patient and attendant alike.

The impetus of actual accomplishment, rather than "made work," makes the program of this department an important factor in the real growth of its students.
