## Pres. Truman Commends No. Shore Cavalcade December 6 and 9

President Truman has commended the Union of American Hebrew Congregations for sponsoring the American Jewish Cavalcade which will stress religion and will be observed at North Shore Congregation Israel, Vernon and Lincoln avenues, Glencoe at 8:15 p.m. on two nights: Friday, Dec. 6, and Monday, Dec. 9.

At the service on Friday evening, Dec. 6, the principal address will be given by Dr. B. Benedict Glazer of Detroit, who occupies the pulpit in the fifth largest Jewish congregation in the United States. On Monday evening, Dec. 9, the address of the day will be delivered by Dr. Julius Gordon of St. Louis, rabbi of one of St. Louis' largest temples. They will be assisted by Rabbis Charles E. Shulman and Richard C. Hertz, of the North Shore congregation. Special music will be given by the temple choir.

President Truman's letter to Adolph S. Rosenberg, president of the Union, is as follows, in part: "I heard with genuine pleasure of the plans of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations to sponsor an American Jewish Cavalcade during the month of November as part of a religious emphasis program designed to re-awaken and further develop a greater interest in religion. I am sure that American Jewry will be the better for the American Jewish Cavalcade."

## USO Committee Formed For Downey Hospital

The formation of a USO committee for Downey hospital has been announced by Mrs. Theodore L. Osborn. Mrs. Osborn represents the Highland Park YWCA on the committee which has as its purpose the fostering of recreational activities for patients outside the veterans' hospital at Downey. The committee is made up of North Shore residents, representing the member agencies of USO and the various communities. USO, which will continue its services to members of the armed forces and hospitalized veterans throughout 1947, is one of the benefiting agencies in the current North Shore Community Chest drive.

"Members of the committee, under USO auspices, will contact community organizations, to interest them in sponsoring recreational and social activities in the communities for veterans, arrange for veterans to attend small parties, go on sightseeing trips, attend athletic and other entertainment events, accompanied by members of the sponsoring organization," Mrs. Osborn explained. "The buddy system will be used, each member being accompanied by a member of the group, thus making it a conversational and social activity."

These are only a few of the items needed.

Any others that can be used in the therapy wards will be very acceptable.
