#### Barrett Tells N.S. Council **About Nuernberg Trials**

The background and origin of the acts of hate charged against Nazi leaders in Count Four of the Neuernberg trials as "crimes against humanity," were described last night (Tuesday) by Roger Barrett, Kenilworth, at a special meeting of the North Shore Council of the National Conference of Christians and Jews.

Barrett, a Chicago lawyer, recently returned from Neurenberg, where he was a member of Justice Jackson's staff, in charge of documents. The meeting was held at the home of Mrs. Abel Davis, 600 Sheridan road, Glencoe. Members of the executive committee and a large number of guests attended.

Barrett traced the early development of the trials, and described highlights of the defendants and the testimony, before discussing the nature and origins of the charges. Hatreds for minority groups, he indicated, were the stepping stones to far greater crimes, committed in a frenzy of self-righteous bigotry and hate for anyone who would not serve the Nazi ideology or whose persecution could further doctrines of the "master race."
