## Abbott Laboratories Test Amidone Drug

Dr. E. H. Volwiler, of N. Deere Park drive, who is director of research at Abbott Laboratories, states that amidone, an undeveloped German drug for relieving pain, is being studied and tested at Abbotts.

Dr. Volwiler, who spent three months during the latter part of the war in Germany, reports that the pharmaceutical laboratories there were so busy manufacturing known remedies that there was no time left for research along new lines.

An emergency blood substitute was developed by the Germans, which is of no use to our laboratories, but the drug amidone, still in its experimental stage in the hands of the Germans, is being studied and tested at Abbott's, and may prove of use. The finished product will probably appear under a different name, Mr. Volwiler intimates.

## Meat-Filled Biscuit Twist



WITH appetites sharpened by blustering January winds comes increased zest for tasty steaming dishes that supply extra energy and staying quality.

Once-empty trays at the butcher's now proudly display greater choices of meat cuts with no point values. Stretching the meat supply, once a great necessity, has become a popular way with most housewives of adding new flavor to favorite meat dishes as well as interest and extra nutrition.

This recipe for Meat Twist is practically a one-dish meal, containing five of the seven groups of food recommended daily for general well-being. A parsley biscuit twist encloses a savory meat filling made still more flavorful and colorful with cheery bits of golden carrots and green beans. Enriched flour, with its added B-vitamins and iron, makes the crisp, golden biscuit twist a good carrier of your money's worth of food value and robust health.

### MEAT-FILLED VEGETABLE TWIST

2 cups sifted enriched flour  
2 teaspoons baking powder  
1 teaspoon salt  
2 to 4 tablespoons shortening  
2 tablespoons chopped parsley  
2 to 3/4 cup milk

Sift together flour, baking powder and salt. Cut or rub in shortening. Add parsley. Add milk to make soft dough. Turn out on lightly floured board and knead 1/2 minute. Roll to sheet 8 1/2 x 6 inches. Place meat filling on 1/2 of dough. With sharp knife or pastry wheel cut 1/2 inch strips from edge of dough toward filling. Twist together 2 strips and fold over meat mixture. Seal edge of twisted biscuit strip to edge of meat-covered biscuit. Place on baking sheet. Bake in moderate oven (375° F.) 30 minutes.

Yield: 6 servings.

### Meat Filling

1 1/2 cups ground cooked meat  
1/2 cup cut cooked string beans  
1/2 cup diced cooked carrots  
2 tablespoons chopped parsley  
1 cup medium white sauce (or left-over gravy)  
Salt and pepper

Mix together meat, string beans, carrots and parsley. Add white sauce and salt and pepper. Blend well.
