## Christmas Seal Sale Still Short of Goal

With returns in the annual Christmas seal sale reported to be somewhat ahead of a year ago, Miss Orpha L. White, executive secretary of the Lake County Tuberculosis association, announces that the campaign is still \$8,000 short of its goal of \$40,000.

Close to 18,000 cards mailed to Lake county residents have not been acknowledged. The current total received at headquarters is \$32,162.17, Miss White said.

"The work of the association in the year ahead depends entirely upon the success of the seal sale. This is the only source of support for the program carried on under the emblem of the double-barred cross.

"The fight must go on. In order that its well defined tasks can be performed right here in Lake county, residents of the community must continue to generously support the work."

The tuberculin testing program and services of the mobile x-ray unit are being rapidly expanded. Continued expansion of the work depends entirely upon seal sale dollars.

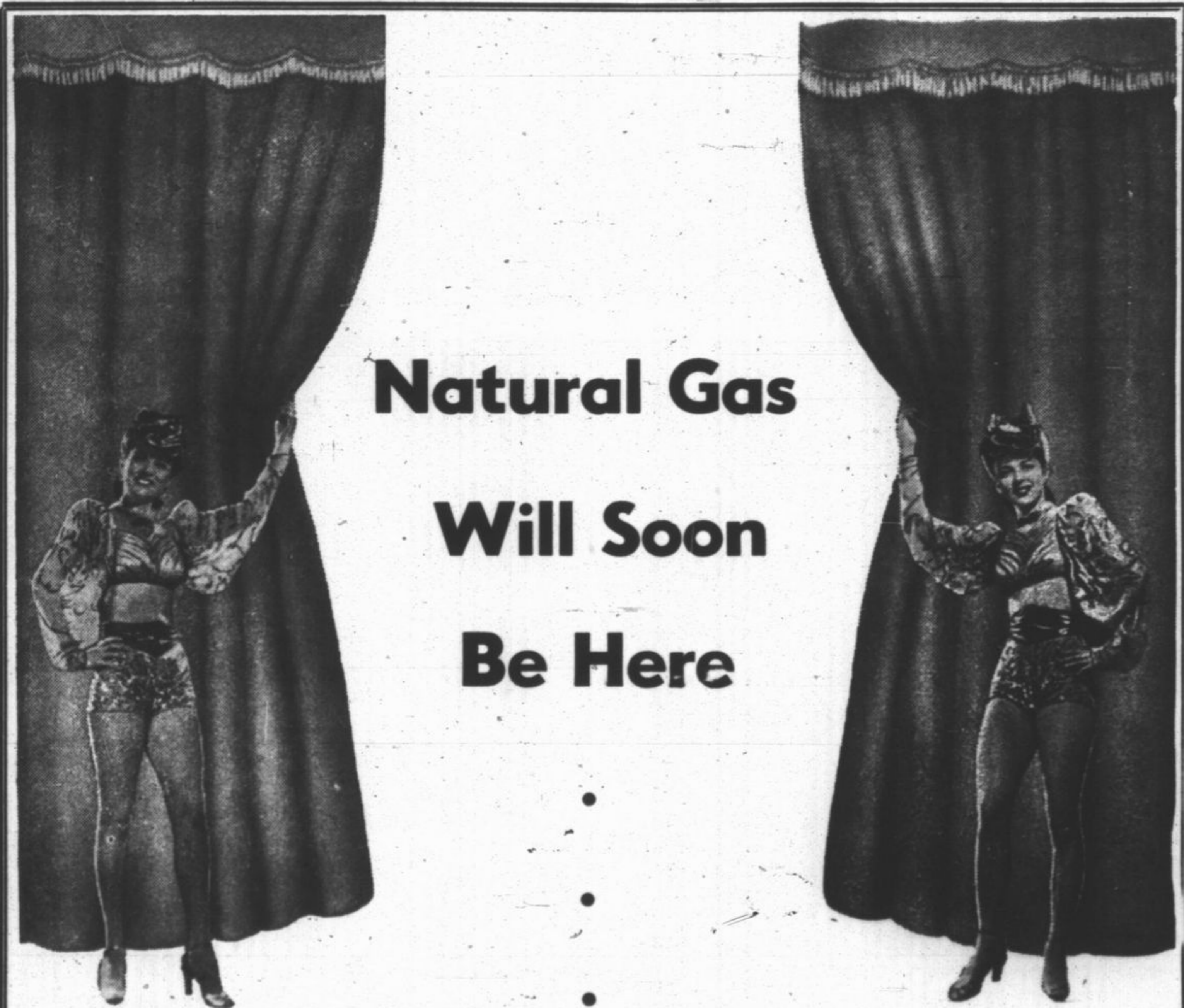
