Highland Park Girl Honored at Iowa State

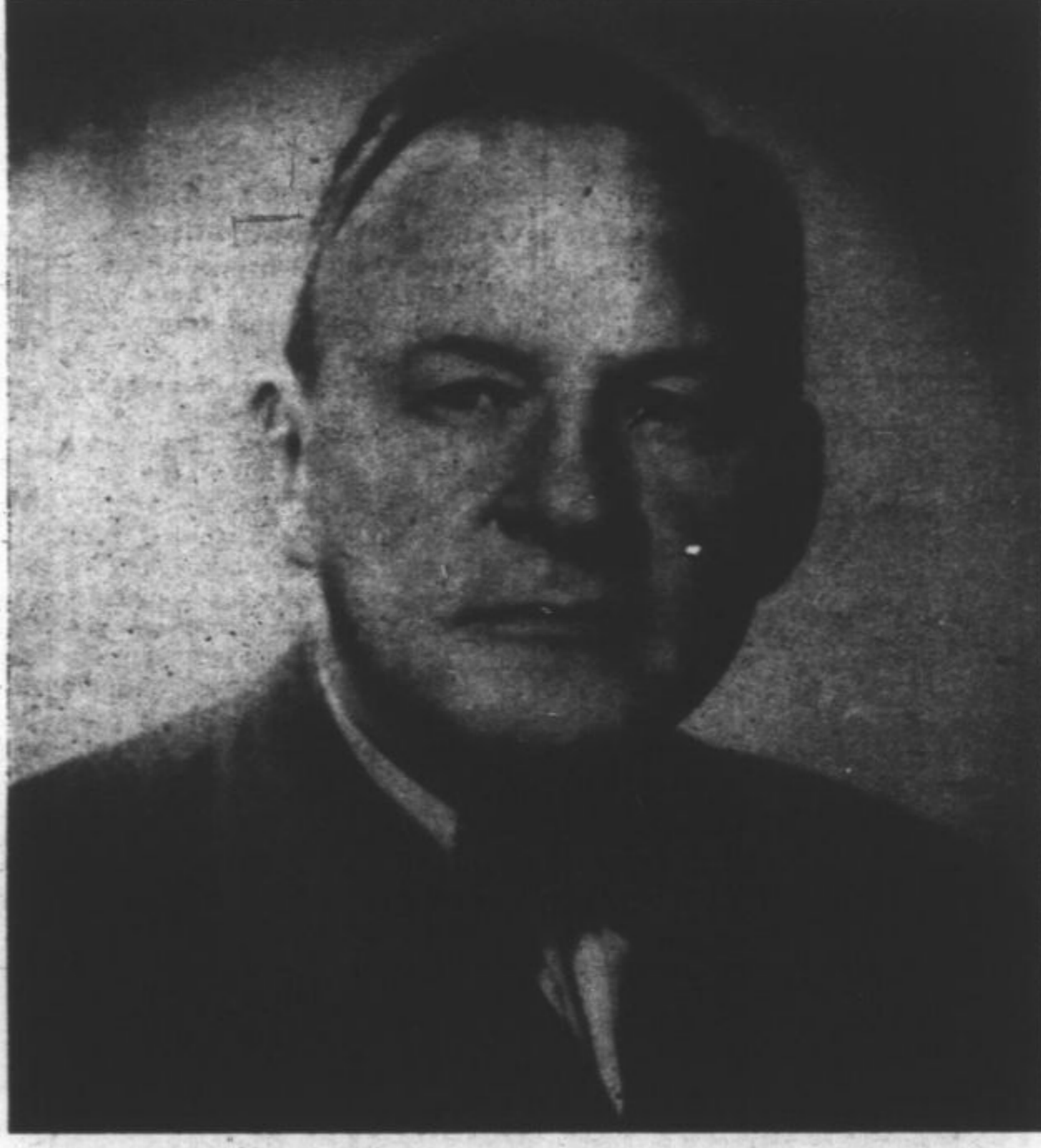
