Martin Insull, Former Utility Tycoon, Succumbs in Canada

Last rites were observed on Wednesday in Orillia, Ont., Can., for Martin Insull, many years a resident of Highland Park, where his daughter, Mrs. Virginia Rafferty, was married. The younger brother and right-hand man of Samuel Insull, who at one time had acquired a 3 1/2 billion dollar utility business reaching into 32 states as well as a part of Canada, Martin Insull was a British subject, who had never relinquished his citizenship.

In 1924, Martin Insull became president of the Middle West utilities, which originated in 1912, and retained active leadership in 1932 when he resigned all connection with the concern and went to live in Orillia. Later, with his brother, he was acquitted of embezzlement and other charges.

Besides his daughter, Virginia, he is survived by a nephew, Samuel Insull Jr. Interment was made in Orillia, where his wife, deceased in 1936, is buried.

List Tare Weights Of Used Fat Cans

Now that meat dealers are paying higher prices for used cooking fat, women realize that salvaging kitchen grease is one way to substantially cut down meat bills. However, they should remember that the tare weight of the container is deducted by the butcher.

For the convenience of housewives and meat dealers, here are the standard weights of cans: Size 1 (such as used for soup)—holds 10 ounces, weighs 2.2 ounces. Size 1 1/2 (used for dog food)—holds 16 ounces, weighs 2.7 ounces. Size 2 (standard for tomatoes)—holds 20 ounces, weighs 3.6 ounces. Size 3 (fruit and vegetables)—holds 1 quart, weighs 5.3 ounces. Size 4 (fruit juice)—holds 48 to 50 ounces, weighs 7 ounces.

"Jerry" Knowlton Appointed Director of Camp Ma-Ka-Ja-Wan

Jerry, as he is better known to the scouts and scouters of the council, is a native of Grand Rapids, Mich. He was educated at the Catholic Central high school in Grand Rapids and Western State university at Kalamazoo. He attended the 46th national training school of Boy Scouts of America and in 1935 joined the professional scouting ranks.

His first assignment was in his home territory, Grand Rapids, where he had attained the rank of Eagle scout and had been a scoutmaster and a member of that council's camp staff. In 1942, Jerry became field executive in the Buffalo council, Buffalo, New York.

Jerry entered the army air forces May, 1943. As a B17 radio operator with the 15th air force, he was stationed at Foggia, Italy. Shot down in a mission over Augsburg, Germany, he was held as a prisoner of war until liberated by the 14th armored division in April of 1945.

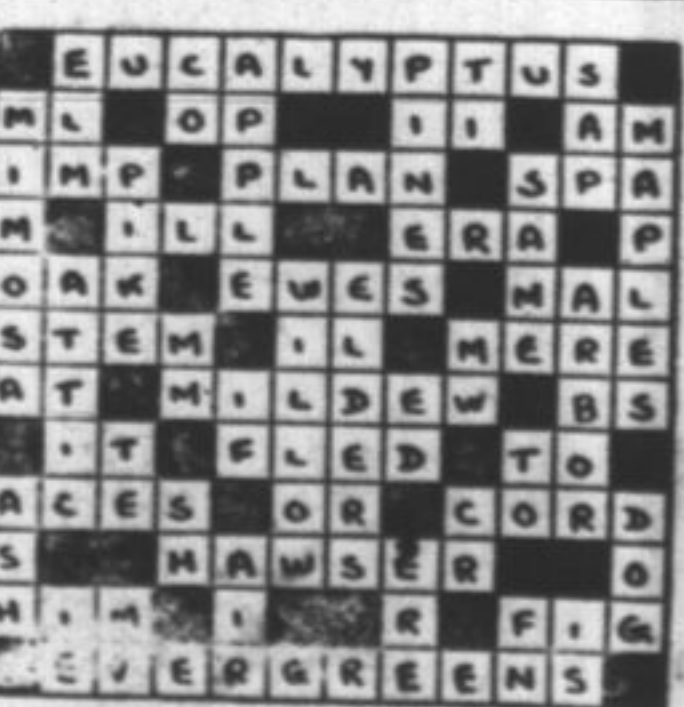
