Confirmation to be Discussed at Temple

This Friday evening at the North Shore Congregation Israel, Rabbi Charles E. Shulman will discuss from his pulpit, "The Significance of Confirmation." The sermon will be dedicated to the fifty children who will be confirmed on Shevuoth morning, Sunday, May 25, and will deal with the values that can be found in Confirmation. It is the ceremony that marks the dignity of Judaism and the dignity of a Jewish person following the traditions of Jewish life hallowed by centuries. Confirmation is one of the rare opportunities in Jewish life to come close to the heart of the Jewish religion. It is observed on an anniversary — the anniversary of the giving of the Ten Commandments at Sinai.
