Vacation Bible School

The plan of the school will include story periods, games, music and handwork of interest and instructive value to all ages. The school is non-sectarian in its teaching and will welcome children from any church not having their own vacation Bible school. Last year the enrollment was over the 100 mark. Special features will be presented at various times during the ten-day school.

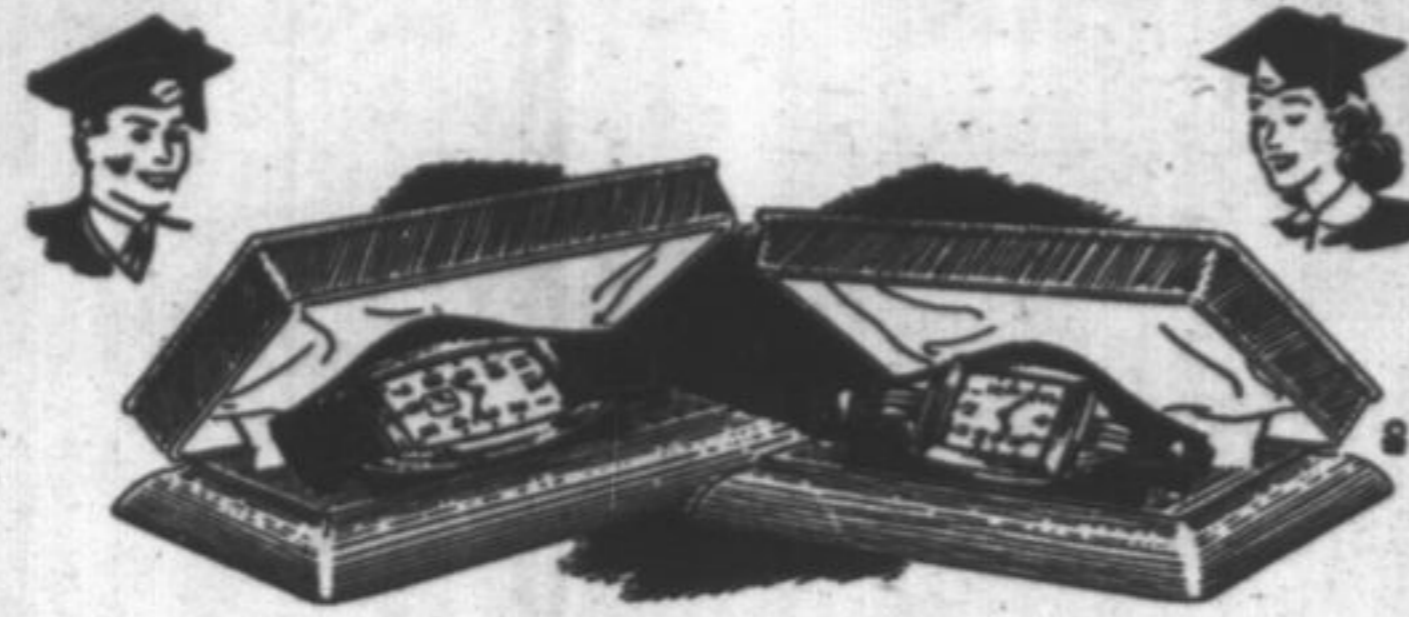

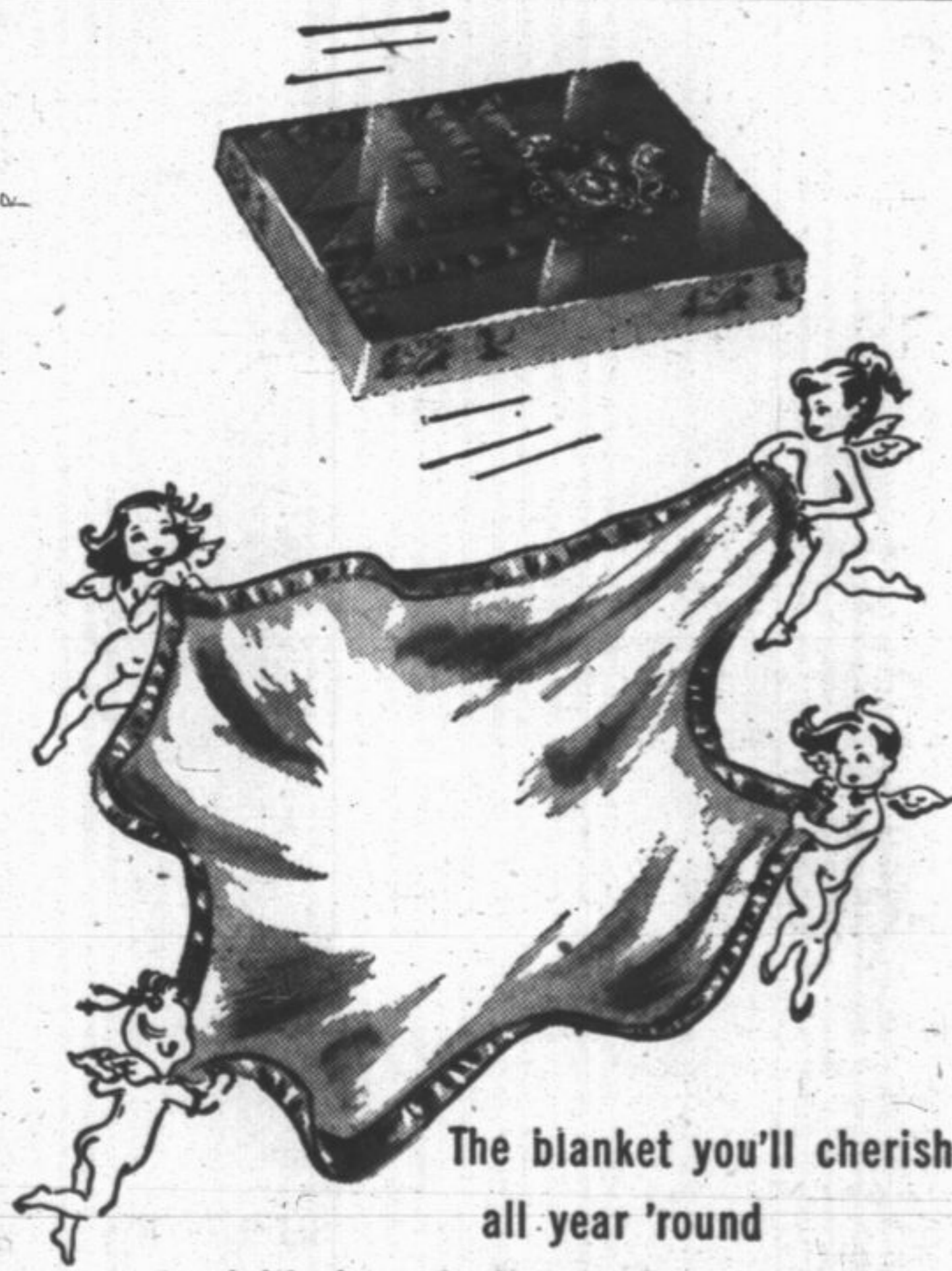
