Meat Flecks with Macaroni



ANOTHER "new" macaroni casserole? New to the family, perhaps, but simple to clever cooks who know how to vary one basic recipe so that it has fresh appeal each time it is served.

Take macaroni and cheese, for example. These two foods make such a popular team that we usually think of them together. Add a bit of left-over meat, a dash of racy Worcestershire Sauce, and a savory new dish is invented.

Meat Flecks with Macaroni has just such a homey origin. Low-cost, nutrition-rich macaroni absorbs and extends the flavor of a bit of meat so satisfactorily that no one suspects that it is an economy dish. The mildness of macaroni blends so well with a wide variety of left-overs that vegetables may be added to make this a one-dish meal. Macaroni made from durum wheat gives these all-for-one and one-for-all combinations an interesting character because the tender tubes, properly cooked, are always shapely and firm.

MEAT FLECKS WITH MACARONI

- 1 tablespoon salt
- 3 quarts boiling water
- 8 ounces elbow macaroni
- 3 cups thin white sauce
- 1 cup grated American cheese
- 1 tablespoon grated onion
- 1/2 teaspoon dry mustard
- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire Sauce
- 1 1/4 cups chopped prepared meat
- 1/2 cup buttered bread crumbs

Add salt to actively boiling water. Gradually add macaroni and let boil until macaroni is tender, about 10 minutes. Combine white sauce, cheese, onion, mustard, and Worcestershire Sauce. Mix well. Drain and rinse macaroni and add macaroni and meat to white sauce mixture. Pour into greased baking dish. Sprinkle with bread crumbs. Bake in moderate oven (375° F.) about 25 minutes.

Yield: About 5 servings.

CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATION

On Wednesday, September 3rd at 8:00 p.m. in the Council Chamber, City Hall, the Civil Service Commission of the City of Highland Park will hold an examination to establish an eligible list for city draftsman. Previous experience in map, civil engineering and general drafting will be considered.

A second examination will be given to establish an eligible list for clerk in the building department. Applicants must be able to do typing, filing and have some knowledge of bookkeeping and of general office work.

An examination will be given to establish an eligible labor service list for the Street Department from which assignments will be made as occasion permits, with salary depending on experience, type and quality of work.

All applicants must pass a medical examination by a medical examiner appointed by the Commission before they are appointed to a position. Applicants for draftsman and clerk may contact City Engineer Cole for information about these positions. Application blanks may be obtained from Mr. V. C. Musser, City Clerk at the City Hall. The State Civil Service law requires a fee of two dollars to be paid by all applicants filing application blanks for clerk in the building department and street laborer and three dollars for draftsman. All applications must be filed with the secretary by 6:00 p.m. Tuesday, September 2.

Heavy Expenditures Foreseen in County For New Farm Homes

Farm families in Lake county will spend more than \$1,162,000 for new housing in the next three to five years, according to a forecast released by the Tile Council of America.

"As a result of high incomes during the last few years, farmers in every part of the nation are prepared to invest record amounts in new home construction and in general farm improvements," said F. B. Ortman, chairman of the Council's residential construction committee.

Pointing out that the comforts and conveniences of urban living are now available to farm families, Ortman said that new rural homes will incorporate such features as central heating, tiled bathrooms and modern kitchen facilities.

Rapid electrification of rural areas of Illinois is making possible the incorporation in new homes of many labor-saving and comfort-providing devices undreamed of a generation ago, according to Ortman. Rural Electrification Administration estimates disclose that more than 66 per cent of all farms in the state now receive central station electric service. Refrigerators, electric washing machines and deep freezing plants, as well as plumbing systems, will go into many new homes as a consequence.
