Florists' Association To Stage Style Show As Benefit Performance

In a glamorous floral setting on the stage of Medinah Temple the creations of the designers will be modeled for an audience of 4,000, probably the largest ever to see a top-flight fashion display at Chicago.

Tickets are on sale at Illinois Epilepsy League, 130 North Wells street, Chicago and at local flower shop members of the Florists' Telegraph Delivery Association. Ticket prices are \$2.40, \$4.80, \$6 and \$10.

As the florists are paying for everything and a Chicago department store will provide the fashion show, the entire proceeds will go to the charity. League members are an earnest and hard working group of young matrons in Chicago society who are collaborating with the florists to put on a spectacular showing of apparel and such an exhibition of flowers being worn, carried and lived among as nonflorists have never looked upon. Rare flowers from all over the world will be flown to Chicago for the evening.

CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATION

On Wednesday, September 3rd at 8:00 p.m. in the Council Chamber, City Hall, the Civil Service Commission of the City of Highland Park will hold an examination to establish an eligible list for city draftsman. Previous experience in map, civil engineering and general drafting will be considered.

A second examination will be given to establish an eligible list for clerk in the building department. Applicants must be able to do typing, filing and have some knowledge of bookkeeping and do general office work.

An examination will be given to establish an eligible labor service list for the Street Department from which assignments will be made as occasion permits, with salary depending on experience, type and quality of work.

All applicants must pass a medical examination by a medical examiner appointed by the Commission before they are appointed to a position. Applicants for draftsman and clerk may contact City Engineer Cole for information about these positions. Application blanks may be obtained from Mr. V. C. Musser, City Clerk at the City Hall. The State Civil Service law requires a fee of two dollars to be paid by all applicants filing application blanks for clerk in the building department and street laborer and three dollars for draftsman. All applications must be filed with the secretary by 6:00 p.m. Tuesday, September 2.

Macaroni Ham Harmony



LEFT-OVERS are as welcome as the first robin's song when they combine their flavors in one taste-tempting dish like this Macaroni Ham Harmony. Chewy, tender macaroni is the happy go-betwixt to stretch a small amount of ham and tasty vegetables to make a hearty main dish for a Gifty March meal.

Penny-wise cooks know that with macaroni always on hand, they have the start of many a tasty, or hearty, casserole treat. Its bland flavor is so congenial that it hobnobs well with any vegetable or protein food, and extends and blends their individual flavors into a harmonious whole. In Macaroni Ham Harmony, ham carries the flavor melody, while the flavor chorus is supplied by celery, green pepper, onion, and stippy cheese. Left-over bread crumbs have a future, too, when they are buttered and arranged in a ring on top of this budget-wise casserole.

Macaroni made from durum wheat has a special quality that enables it to retain its shape when cooked, yet remain chewy and tender. Thus it not only upgrades the flavors of other more

highly-flavored foods, but lends body and a distinctive character of its own to combination dishes.

MACARONI HAM HARMONY
1 tablespoon salt
3 quarts boiling water
4 ounces elbow macaroni
1 tablespoon fat
1/2 cup chopped celery
1/4 cup chopped onion
1/4 cup chopped green pepper
1/2 pound cubed cooked ham (1 1/2 cups)
2 cups medium white sauce
1/4 cup buttered bread crumbs
1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese

Add 1 tablespoon salt to actively boiling water. Gradually add macaroni and boil until tender (about 8 minutes). Drain and rinse. While macaroni is cooking, melt fat in skillet. Add celery, onion, green pepper, and ham and cook until tender, about 10 minutes. Fold ham mixture and macaroni into white sauce. Pour into greased 1 1/2-quart casserole. Sprinkle with buttered bread crumbs. Bake in moderate oven (350° F.) 30 minutes. Serve hot with grated Parmesan cheese.

Yield: 4 servings.
