Dr. Stephen S. Wise To Speak at Friday Night Services at Glencoe
Friday/night services at the North Shore Congregation Israel

In Glencoe, will bring the celebrated Dr. Stephen S. Wise of the Free Synagogue in New York City to the pulpit. His sermon is entitled "Is Israel Immortal?"

In 1907, Dr. Wise realized a dream when he founded the Free Synagogue of New York City, based on freedom of expression for the rabbi, and free and unassigned pews. It was to establish a precedent of democracy in religion, which he felt did not exist in the synagogue at that time, that he aimed his hopes. He felt that the spiritual leader alone should decide what his utterances from the pulpit would be. By making a public issue of pulpit freedom, Dr. Wise helped strengthen the liberal forces in American Jewry.

He founded the Jewish Institute of Religion to train young men and women for Jewish ministry education and social service. The Institute is not devoted to any particular sect of Judaism but rather tries to meet the needs of Orthodox, Conservative, Reform Reconstructionist, Zionist and Non-Zionist groups.

Services start at 8:15. The invitation to hear Dr. Wise is extended to the public.

ILL. Commerce Commission Holds Hearing On Bus Situation

Bus service is essential between Waukegan and Chicago if north shore suburban communities are to continue to progress, witnesses told members of the Illinois Commerce Commission last Monday, November 17.

At an all day hearing, representatives of business, industry, the Navy and citizens groups testified in favor of the North Shore Bus Company's application to establish an inter-community bus system to serve all of the north shore towns.

It was pointed out that the buses would relieve the Shore Line Route trains of much short-haul local riding which would permit adoption of faster schedules and more attractive service for longer haul passengers. This would have the effect of bringing more business to the railway and would increase its earnings.

More than 40 other persons, including housewives, owners of businesses and frequent riders between north shore suburban towns, testified that a definite need existed for the increased transportation that would be made available by the bus operation.

Lesser use of private automobiles was indicated, on direct testimony, because of difficulties experienced at present in finding automobile parking space in most of the business and shopping districts of the communities which the bus line would serve.

It was definitely developed that all of the witnesses were aware
