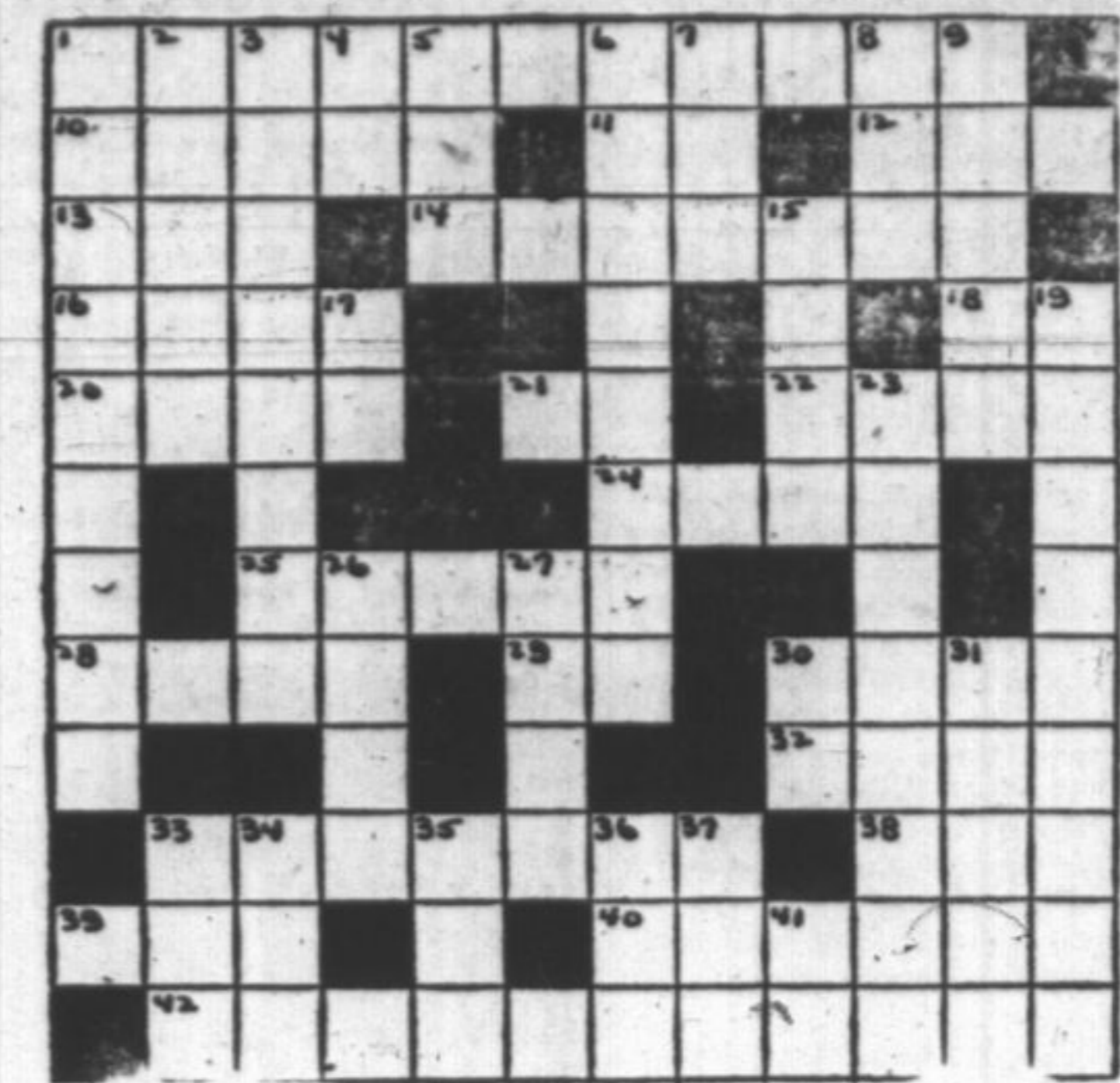

**Young Midwest Singers To Have Chance In Opera**  
A group of young Chicago and Midwest singers will have their "big break" when Opera Theater's first auditions are held in several Chicago voice studios on January 12, 1948.  
Between 11 and 16 finalists will be chosen by secret ballot, and will be recommended to Giovanni Cardelli, managing director of Opera Theater, and his committee of judges, for possible roles in forthcoming Opera Theater productions.  
A group of semi-finalists will be selected in the January 12 auditions, and will be asked to sing again on January 13. From these the finalists will be chosen for recommendation.  
The auditions are the result of the pledging of cooperation by the Chicago Singing Teachers' Guild, in Opera Theater's plan to discover and bring recognition to midwestern artists who are judged ready to start their careers. Mr. Cardelli said that candidates must be prepared to meet high dramatic as well as musical standards.  
Mme. Sonia Sharnova, Chicago vocalist and teacher, is chairman of the auditions committee.
