AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE CREATING A TRAFFIC COMMISSION AND ESTABLISHING TRAFFIC REGULATIONS FOR THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS PASSED AND APPROVED MARCH 19, 1941"
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:
SECTION I. That Schedule VIII attached to and made a part of an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Creating a Traffic Commission and Establishing Traffic Regulations for the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, Passed and Approved March 19, 1941" and being the Schedule of said Ordinance prescribing and designating stop intersections for traffic in said City, be and it is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following:
On Bloom Street proceeding either east or west stop at North St. Johns Avenue.
SECTION II. The City Traffic Engineer be and he is authorized and directed to install at such intersection official traffic signs.
SECTION III. This amending ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its filing, passage, approval and publication as required by law.
