On the lighter side was the picture of Highland Park Anson Brown, present at the Bikini incident, shown on the deck of one of the boats, struggling with the necessary gear. Mr. Brown was in the Thursday evening audience.

A ripple was occasioned by the naive astonishment pictured on the faces of the Bikini evacuees at the sight of American men doing the heavy work of moving, usually reserved for Island women.

The speaker was introduced by Harold O. McLain, who is responsible for the appearance of so many fine speakers on Highland Park platforms.
