"The Firefly" in Chicago For Limited Engagement
 "The Firefly," which opens a limited engagement at the Blackstone theatre, Chicago, on Christmas night, celebrated its thirty-fifth birthday this month in Boston, as it was on December 2, 1912 that Arthur Hammerstein, uncle of the famous Oscar Hammerstein 2nd, first presented this, the first of Rudolf Friml's many musical hits, on Broadway, with Emma Trentini as its star. This was the pint sized grand opera prima donna's first appearance in a light musical production.

The following season Mr. Hammerstein brought "The Firefly" to Chicago with Miss Trentini continuing in the role of Nina. This, according to many theatrical historians, was the only engagement that "The Firefly" has ever played in Chicago. This is not the case in many other cities, however, as it has been revived time after time by theatre and al fresco summer musical repertoire impresarios from Los Angeles to New York.

Ever since it was first sung on Broadway the score of "The Firefly" has been a favorite among music minded Americans with "Sympathy" being rated by many as one of this country's all time hits, and "Giannina Mia" running it a close second. "Love is Like a Firefly," "Dawn of Love" and "The Promise in a Woman's Smile" also have their admirers and in the majority of light musicals would have been standout hits.

In casting the current revival of "The Firefly" the Messrs. Shubert have assigned the leading comedy roles to seasoned performers with Jack Goode, last seen in Chicago as Benny in "The Desert Song," being featured as Jenkins, the hypochondriacal valet, Hank Henry as Hugo Gusset, and Sparky Kaye as Pietro, acting as his principal aids. Kaye Deslys, late of the movies, will play Mrs. Van Dare, the clinging widow, also a comedy role.

For the romantic singing roles the producers have gone in for youth, with Gracia Aurelia and Beverly Shearer, both of whom are barely out of their teens, alternating in Nina, the Trentini part, and Sybil Van Dare, the second soprano lead, while Frank Melton and Melton Moore, both in the early stages of their theatrical careers appear as Jack Travers and John Thurston, leading tenor

and baritone roles. Gloria Evans is the Suzette and Gloria Ware the Geraldine Van Dare. Youth also dominates the large singing and dancing chorus.

During the stay at the Blackstone, "The Firefly" will be presented every night and on Saturday and Sunday afternoons.

 and Mrs. Russel Smith with their 14-month-old daughter, Patty, Mrs. Lemmon had only time to don a robe, and escape, while Mr. Smith assisted his wife, and Mr. Lemmon rescued the Smith baby. Fastened in the bed by a harness, the baby was removed by taking mattress and all with it. All the occupants found refuge — the Christmans with their son Don, 637 Laurel, the Lemmons with Mrs. Lemmon's family, and the Smiths with Mr. Smith's mother, at Urbana, Ill.

Only one of the nine rooms was spared—a newly constructed bedroom on the first floor. The damage is estimated at \$5,000.
