What do they do with it? That question has not been asked or answered, but it is conceivable it would go into the corporate fund, to be used for any purpose whatsoever that the city council might decide on and not exclusively for the repair and maintenance of the streets and highways.

The citizens owning automobiles are already subject to many taxes and penalties imposed upon them because of their ownership and use of an automobile. There is a federal tax on the purchase price; there is a state tax or license, for so-called registration plates; the city of Highland Park taxes for what is called vehicle license.
