NOTICE OF ELECTION
PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that on Saturday, the 26th day of April, A.D. 1948, a special election will be held in and for the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, at which election there will be submitted to the voters of said City the following propositions:

I. PROPOSITION TO INCREASE MAXIMUM CORPORATE FUND TAX RATE.

"Shall the maximum tax rate for the corporate fund of the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, be established at 27 per cent on full, fair cash value instead of 12 1/2 per cent; the maximum rate otherwise applicable to the next taxes to be extended?"

The approximate amount extendable under the proposed rate of 27 per cent is \$221,133 and the approximate amount extendable under the rate of 12 1/2 per cent, otherwise applicable to the next taxes to be extended, is \$100,738; such amounts being computed upon the last known full, fair cash value.

II. PROPOSITION TO INCREASE MAXIMUM STREET AND BRIDGE FUND TAX RATE.

"Shall the maximum tax rate for the street and bridge fund of the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, be established at 10 per cent on full, fair cash value instead of 6 3/4 per cent; the maximum rate otherwise applicable to the next taxes to be extended?"

The approximate amount extendable under the proposed rate of 10 per cent is \$81,902 and the approximate amount extendable under the rate of 6 3/4 per cent, otherwise applicable to the next taxes to be extended, is \$30,394; such amounts being computed upon the last known full, fair cash value.

Such election will be held in the several election precincts of the City as described and/or created by an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance establishing and fixing election precincts in the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois," passed December 19, 1938 and approved December 19, 1938, and the voting place in and for each of the respective precincts shall be as follows:

CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK
CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATION
On Tuesday, April 6th at 8:30 P.M. in the Council Chamber, City Hall, the Civil Service Commission of the City of Highland Park will hold an examination to establish an eligible list for assistant building inspector. No person shall be admitted to the examination who is not a citizen of the United States and who has not been an actual resident of the City of Highland Park for at least six months preceding the date of examination. All applicants must pass a medical examination by a medical examiner appointed by the Commission before they are appointed to a position.

All applicants must be a graduate of an Engineering School, expecting to graduate this summer or have completed a four year course in Engineering from a school of recognized standing. Physical ability, previous experience and completion of college or university courses in surveying, testing materials, management and organization, dynamics and stresses, heating and ventilating, electrical course, administration and business interviewing, some psychology, drafting and design, with a general knowledge of typing and filing will be considered.

Application blanks may be obtained from the city clerk. The State Civil Service law requires a fee of three dollars to be paid by all applicants when filing applications. All applications must be filed with the secretary by 6:00 P.M. Tuesday, April 6th.
