Congressman Church Announces Examinations For W. Point and Annapolis

More than the usual number of applications for appointment to the U. S. Naval and Military Academies are being received by Congressman Ralph E. Church, which indicate the desire of the young men to be of service to their country should a serious international situation develop in the future.

Congressman Church announced today from Washington that he will hold his annual U.S. Civil Service competitive examinations for appointments to West Point and Annapolis in July 1948, although the definite date has not yet been set by the Civil Service Commission.

All candidates must be of sound physical health and good moral character, and must be not less than 17 nor more than 21 years of age on April 1, 1948.

Letters of application to take the competitive examination should be addressed to Congressman Ralph E. Church, House of Representatives, Washington, D. C.

A native of Columbia, Missouri, Miss Maupin, a member of the Baptist church, received her diploma from Drake university in 1926, majoring in music and drama. Later she studied speech and music at Iowa university, returning in 1933 to Drake where she received her B.S. degree in sociology, psychology and economics. In 1940 she again attended Drake, studying philosophy and sociology.

A member of the Council of Social Agencies, Delta Sigma Theta sorority, and National Musicians and Iowa State Teachers' associations, she served, during the war years with the YWCA-USO, gaining wide and varied experience in the fields of social work and education. She taught in the Arkansas Baptist college for one year and served as supervisor of music in public schools at Ardmore, Oklahoma, and Columbia, Missouri. She also worked for the Department of Education in Washington D. C., was executive director of the Blue Triangle YWCA for two years and a member of the staff of the YWCA in Detroit in 1942-43.

Miss Maupin is an old friend of Mrs. Mary Ann Macfaden, Executive director of the Highland Park YWCA, both YWCA-USO directors attending many conferences and conventions together.




