North Shore Railway Officials Eager To Resume Operations

CHICAGO-The management of the Chicago North Shore & Milwaukee Railway is willing and eager to resume operations at the earliest possible moment, according to a statement issued today by Bernard J. Fallon, president of the company.

Fallon stated that the manage ment understands and sympathizes with the vital need of many communities serviced by the railroad for an early settlement of outstanding difficulties and resumption of service, "Conditional on the Illinois Commerce Commission's approval of a request for increased fares," Fallon said, "the company stands ready to resume operations on both the Skokie Valley and Shore Line, granting an immediate increase of 151/2 cents an hour to all employees, effective upon resumption of service. in the case of the Shore would be on a test basis for a limited period to determine whether or not this branch of the railroad can, with increased fares, be operated on a good business basis.
