Beauty at Home

Q. What can I do to bleach and soften skin which has become darkened and discolored?
A. Lemon juice added to your cleansing cream (and kept in a cool place so it will not turn rancid) will help wonderfully.

Q. Please give me a good waist-reducing exercise.
A. Stand erect with feet 18 inches apart and hands on hips. Bend forward; then swing and bend to the right. Do the same backward, and toward the left. Return to original position. Keep repeating.

Q. Can you give me a hint to help care for a permanent wave?
A. Brilliantine, used sparingly and sprayed on the hair with an atomizer, is a good help.

Q. What can I do for dry and cracking skin on my feet?
A. Massage thoroughly every night after a foot bath with a rich cream or heated olive oil. You should wear cotton socks to bed, not only to protect the linen, but to do a better job. In the morning, don't wash off — but wipe the feet with a towel. Cracked skin, of course, must be treated with a germicide and patches of clean gauze or cotton worn over them.

Q. What is a good treatment for dry skin?
A. Vigorous massage is splendid, and this is better given if the dry skin is lubricated with oil or cream, and once either is removed and the face washed, the skin may be further invigorated with hot and cold rinsings. Brisk hand patting is the best way to dry your face!

Q. How can I clean excessively oily hair?
A. An occasional dry shampoo with finely-powdered orris root is effective. Put the powder through a fine sieve, sprinkle through the hair, and then brush out until every particle is removed.

Q. What is a treatment which will induce body skin beauty?
A. A mild epsom salts bath is wonderfully beneficial. Use a pound to a generous tubful of hot water.

Q. Is there some way I can relieve persistent constipation?
A. Try drinking one or two glasses of water before breakfast, and following a diet of coarse cereals, green vegetables, and large quantities of fruit. Honey is also very good for constipation. Thorough sanitation is important!

Q. How should a woman with a large nose wear her hair?
A. The hair should be worn loosely at the back to balance the profile, but the thickness should begin at the front of the nose, never above it.

How Can I?

Q. How can I smooth a scuffed place in the leather of a shoe?
A. When you discover a piece of loose leather on a scuffed shoe, do not tear it off. Apply a little liquid nail polish, paste it down securely, shine the shoe, and the place will never be noticeable.

Q. How can I take away the cloudy appearance of soup?
A. Try dropping the white of an egg into the soup, and when it curdles, remove it. This will take away any impurity that is in the soup.

Q. How can I remove fruit stains, and also ink stains, from linen?
A. One effective method is to hold it over the fumes of a small piece of burning sulphur. This should be done immediately. Do not fail to dampen the linen before igniting the sulphur.

Q. How can I treat the white lines between the bricks in a fireplace, that have become a dirty gray?
A. Use a small pointed brush and paint them with black lacquer. The fireplace will be modern and clean-looking when it is finished.

Q. How can I remove a stamp from an envelope?
A. Soak a blotter in water, then place it over the stamp and hold for a minute.

Q. How can I prevent rubber boots from cracking?
A. Rubber boots will not crack, and the air will be permitted to circulate freely through them, if the boots are held erect with rolls of cardboard when they are not in use.

Q. How can I prevent starch from sticking?
A. Starch will not stick if a drop or two of kerosene, or a little lard, is added to a small basin of starch and then allowed to come to a boil.

Q. How can I prevent rugs from curling at the corners?
A. Sew a small triangular piece of corrugated rubber to the wrong side of each corner.
