## Beauty at Home

Q. What makeup should be used for the abnormally thin face?

A. You can make this type of face appear broader by placing the color spot closer to the ears. However, avoid using too much rouge and also add a touch of rouge to the chin.

Q. What can be done for blackheads and whiteheads on the back?

A. Frequent scrubbing with a stiff brush and soap after the back has soaked in cream or oil for a half-hour will help lots.

Q. How can I make wrinkles around my eyes less noticeable?

A. Don't squint when you powder your face. It draws up the muscles around the eyes and gives an aged look. Instead, place the brush below the eye and the index finger at the eyebrow, stretching the skin area. Then powder.

Q. Is there some way I can cause a bulge at the back of my neck to disappear?

A. This is usually caused by extensive reading, sewing, potting, and the like. Counteract it by rolling your head, clockwise and counter-clockwise, and hunching your shoulders up and down, and round and round.

Q. What can I do to prevent brittle fingernails?

A. The exercise of sturdy buffing makes nails stronger and less prone to splinter. Leaving nail polish off helps in many cases. Milk, eggs, and raw vegetables are as surecures as any!

Q. Can you give me some eye and eyebrow makeup hints?

A. Before using mascara, use a swab-stick dipped in water to remove all traces of powder, which clogs mascara. Skin freshener or alcohol should be used on surface of skin before tweezing eyebrows. Avoid broken edges by plucking in the direction eyebrows grow.

Q. Please tell me how to make a good skin tonic at home.

A. Equal portions of witch hazel and water, to which about 30 drops of tincture of benzoin are added, is good.

Q. What can be done for streaky, tangled hair which has been overdyed?

A. Probably nothing is better than an egg shampoo.

### NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

#### PARK DISTRICT OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 14th day of August, 1948, an election will be held in and for the Park District of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said District the following proposition:

Shall the maximum tax rate for the corporate fund of the Park District of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, be established at .05 per cent on full fair cash value instead of .028 per cent, the maximum rate otherwise applicable to the next taxes to be extended?

It is estimated that the approximate amount extendable under the proposed rate of .05 per cent is \$34,981.96, and the approximate amount extendable under the rate of .028 per cent, otherwise applicable to the next taxes to be extended is \$19,589.90, such amounts being computed upon the last known full fair cash value.

Said election shall be held in the four election precincts heretofore established for all elections in and for said Park District, the boundaries of each precinct and the polling place therefor being as follows:

**First Precinct:** All of that portion of the Park District of Highland Park which lies East of the Center line of the Easterly right of way of the Chicago and Northwestern Railway Company and Northwesterly of the center line of Beech Street, in said Park District of Highland Park.

**Polling Place:** Davis - Maurine Electric Service, 10 N. Sheridan Road.

**Second Precinct:** All of that portion of the Park District of Highland Park which lies East of the Center line of the East Skokie Drainage Ditch and Southeastly of a line described as follows: Beginning at the intersection of Beech Street and the shore of Lake Michigan, thence Southwesterly along Beech Street to the intersection of Beech Street and Ridgewood Drive, thence Southwesterly along Ridgewood Drive to the intersection of South Green Bay Road, thence Southeastly along South Green Bay Road to the intersection of Edgewood Road (Edgewood Road being the North line of Section 35, Township 43 North, Range 12 East of the 3rd P.M.), thence West along the North line of Section 35, Township 43 North, Range 12 East of the 3rd P. M. to the point of intersection with the Center line of the East Skokie Drainage Ditch.

**Polling Place:** C. N. S. & M. R. Ravinia Station, South St. Johns Avenue.

**Third Precinct:** All of that portion of the Park District of Highland Park which lies East of the Center line of the East Skokie Drainage Ditch, and Southwesterly of the Center line of the Chicago and Northwestern Railway Company, and Northwesterly of a line described as follows: Commencing at the intersection of Beech Street and the Center line of the Easterly right of way of the Chicago and Northwestern Railway Company, thence Southwesterly along Beech Street to the intersection of Beech Street and Ridgewood Drive, thence Southwesterly along Ridgewood Drive to the intersection of Ridgewood Drive and South Green Bay Road, thence Southeastly along South Green Bay Road to the intersection of Edgewood Road (Edgewood Road being the North line of Section 35, Township 43 North, Range 12, East of the 3rd P.M.), thence West along the North line of Section 35, Township 43 North, Range 12 East of the 3rd P. M. to the point of intersection with the Center line of the East Skokie Drainage Ditch.

**Polling Place:** Highland Park Community Center, 549 Central Avenue.

**Fourth Precinct:** All of that portion of the Park District of Highland Park which lies West of the Center line of the East Skokie Drainage Ditch.
