Q. What treatment can I follow for ivy poisoning?

A. Wash the part affected with a boric solution, and follow with an application of zinc ointment. Wash off every day with the boric solution, dry, and apply some fresh eintment.

Q. How can I treat dry skin? A. Wrinkles occur most frequently in dry skin, and it is not wise to use soap and water oftener than once a day. After washing the face at night, apply a generous layer of tissue cream, nourishing cream, or skin food, leaving on for a few minutes. Remove the excess, but leave a thin film on overnight. Protect the skin with cream from the sun or wind.

Q. How can I prepare my own liquid soap shampoo at home? A. Shave a cake of your favorite soap (or pure Castile soap) into a

pint of water and melt over a low flame. After thoroughly dissolved, strain through a cheesecloth, and bottle tightly.

Q. What rouge application will rejuvenate my face on a day when it seems unusually drawn and color-

A. Apply a lighter shade of rouge, the same shade as the cheeks, to the center of the upper eyelid, and blend nearly up to the eyebrow. Add a little touch to the end of the nose and to the edges of the nostrils, and a small dab on the chin; also a faint touch to the ear lobes. Cover the face with powder over these rouged places, and it will add a much more youthful appearance to your face.


