Chicago Railroad Fair Draws Huge Crowds

Chicagoans are attending the national Railroad Fair in record numbers. Paid admissions totaled 417,525 at the end of the ninth day of the Fair, Wednesday, July 28. In the same period admissions to the grandstand for four daily performances of "Wheels a-Rolling," the spectacular pageant of transportation which is central attraction at the Fair, amounted to 133,427.

Four governors of states attended the national Railroad Fair during the three-day period, Saturday through Monday, July 31, Aug. 1 and 2. Governor Green of Illinois attended the Fair Saturday. The governors of Colorado and Utah made it Sunday, and on Monday, the governor of Indiana arrived.

Born in Ontario, Canada, on July 29, 1863, Mrs. Donohue came to the United States in 1888.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Chris, and daughter, Margaret. One son, Arthur Crawford, survives.
