Beauty at Home By Lynn Carter

Q. My face is unusually short. How should I apply my makeup?
A: You can make it appear longer by placing the rouge spots as high as possible on the cheek and blending it carefully outward from the rouge spot.

Q. What is a good treatment for knees and elbows to keep them smooth and soft?
A. Rub cream into them just before taking your bath. This is an ideal time, too, to let your face cream do its work. Put it on before getting into the tub and leave it on until you have finished.

Q. How can the superfluous hairs on the legs be bleached, if one does not want to shave them?
A. Use peroxide of hydrogen, or a mixture of one part ammonia to six parts of peroxide.

Q. What is a good hairbrushing technique?
A. Part the hair in strips about an inch wide and six inches long. Hold the strip in the air with the left hand, and with the right hand place the brush bristles close to the roots and let them sweep up through the strip to the ends. Repeat five or six times, and then take another strip. This encourages gloss.

Q. What can be done for occasional pimples on the face?
A. A handful of starch in the morning bath, and a thick paste of starch spread on at night before retiring helps wonderfully.

Q. What can I do to make my eyes appear larger?
A. Deepen your eyeshadow in the center of your eyelids, blending out to the outer end of the eyes.

Q. Please give me a good facial mask.
A. One of the best consists of honey, oatmeal, and milk. Equal parts of the first two are mixed with enough milk to form a paste.

Q. My face is a little too wide. How can I make it appear narrower?
A. You might try placing your rouge in a small triangle between the cheekbones and the nose.

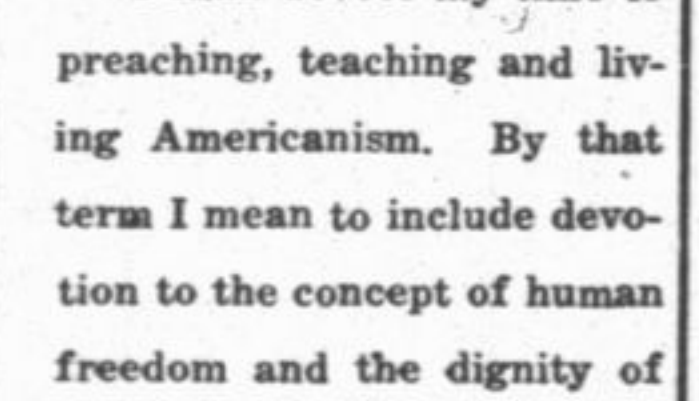
