Beauty at Home

Q. What is the proper makeup for the broad or round face?

A. Be sure to place the color spot just above the cheek, which tends to break up the face breadth. Also, blend rouge in line from beneath eyes and along side of nose and corner of mouth.

Q. How does one prevent the eyelashes from becoming dry and brittle?

A. Each night use a lash lubricant and after applying lash coloring, brush a bit of the lubricant over it. Keep your lids glistening with a touch of oil or vaseline. Dull eyes are never beautiful. Get a shine in and around your eyes!

Q. My hair has become dry, brittle, and streaked. What can I do?

A. Avoid frequent shampoos for a while, but brush your hair religiously every day, and rotate the scalp with your fingertips. A hot oil treatment before the shampoo is very beneficial.

Q. Can you give me an easy, quick way to freshen "stale" makeup?

A. Squeeze a pad of absorbent cotton in cold water, dip into skin freshener, and press this over the face very lightly. It absorbs oil and shine. Then add a tiny bit of powder.

Q. How can I make the front of my neck plumper?

A. Massage olive oil or a pure cold cream freely into the skin with the first three fingers of each hand, massaging first on the right side of the neck, then the left. The motion should be a rotary one, which is circulation-inducing.

Q. What is a good tonic for dry brunette hair?

A. Sulphate of quinine, 20 grains; fluid extract of jaborandi, one ounce; glycerine, two ounces; cologne, four ounces; bay rum, four ounces; rose-water, 20 ounces.

Q. What is a good deodorant I can mix at home?

A. Mix together 2½ ounces of boric acid, ½-ounce zinc oxide, and ½-ounce of talc.

Q. How can the eyes be made to appear larger?

A. Try penciling the eyebrows lower than you ordinarily would.
