## USED FAT IS ASSET

## How Can I???

Q. How can I remove varnish from metal?  
 A. Old varnish can be removed from metal by dipping the article into equal parts of ammonia and alcohol.

Q. How can I renew dull patent leather?  
 A. The dull patent leather bag, or other articles of this leather, can be made to look like new by rubbing it thoroughly with a little milk and then polishing it with a dry cloth.

Q. How can I keep plants moist?  
 A. Water-soaked newspaper twisted round the roots of the plants, against the dirt, will keep the plants moist.

Q. How can I separate stamps that are stuck together?  
 A. If they are stuck together or to a piece of paper, place a thin piece of paper over them and then rub a hot iron over this paper, very lightly.

Q. How can I dissolve beeswax and turpentine floor wax?  
 A. Mix a little ammonia with the beeswax and turpentine, and the wax will dissolve readily.

Q. How can I clean silver slippers?  
 A. Silver slippers can be cleaned with very finely powdered alabaster. Take up some of the powder with a soft brush and rub until the surface becomes bright and clean. Then polish with another brush until the powder is removed and the luster appears.

Q. How can I make a good toilet perfume?  
 A. By mixing two ounces of alcohol with one-half ounce of orris root. Keep it tightly corked in a bottle, and shake thoroughly each time before using.

Q. How can I clean outdoor brass fixtures?  
 A. Use scouring soap that is mixed with kerosene. Apply with a flannel cloth and rub thoroughly.

Q. How can I exterminate roaches?  
 A. Use equal parts of plaster of Paris and powdered sugar. Lime powder well spread about is also good. Or, try powdered borax mixed with sugar. Also, wet a clean rag with kerosene and press it into the holes or corners where they enter.
