### CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATION

On Tuesday, September 28th at 8:00 P. M. in the Council Chamber, City Hall, the Civil Service Commission of the City of Highland Park will hold an examination to establish an eligible list for Stenographer for the City Clerk. Applicants must be able to take dictation, transcribe, do typing and have some knowledge of bookkeeping and be able to do general office work. Salary will be between \$2,200 and \$2,400 per year depending on experience and ability.  
A second examination will be given to establish an eligible list for assistant water meter reader for the water department. Applicants must have some knowledge of reading meters, meter repairs and local water system. Salary \$2,400 to \$2,600 per year depending on experience and ability.  
A promotional examination will be given the same evening to the assistant meter reader to the position of Water meter reader.  
Application blanks for any of the above positions may be obtained from Mr. V. C. Muser, City Clerk at the City Hall. The state civil service law requires a fee of two dollars to be paid at the time of filing application. All applications must be filed with the

secretary by 4:00 P. M. Saturday, September 25th.
