Bounty at Home

Q. Do you consider plucking the eyebrows in good taste?
A. No; plucked eyebrows give a wash-like unreality to the face. Eye brows add character, but their combs should be gently controlled by removing any stray hairs that mar the beauty of their outline.
Q. What fruit is one of the great aids to beauty?
A. The lemon. Its juice may be taken the first thing in the morning in hot water for a clear complexion. It may be used to soften and bleach the skin. And the juice may be used as a rinse after a shampoo to highlight the gloss of your hair.
Q. How should eyeshadow be applied to the eyelids?
A. Very lightly, with the fingertip. Smooth it up to the eyebrows and deepen it just above the edge of the lashes. To add "naturalness", use a bit of eye cream.
Q. How can too-oily and too-dry skin be corrected?
A. Use an unguent and skin freshener for aging or very dry and supersensitive skin. For oily skin, use a texture cream (oily) and mild astringent, to help overcome this condition.
Q. Should the color of the teeth govern one's lipstick shade?
A. By all means. If the teeth are naturally yellowish, avoid orange shades of lipstick.
Q. What rouge do you recommend for use while swimming?
A. Liquid rouge is very popular. Wet the cheek, dab on a very little rouge with a piece of cotton and blend it quickly before it dries. It lasts a long time, but is rather hard to apply.
Q. What are some rules for oily-skinned people to observe?
A. Exercise daily without fail, keep bowels functioning freely, eat no fried foods, eat lots of fresh fruits and vegetables, whole grains, and dairy products.
Q. What type of dress should a girl with sloping shoulders wear?
A. Her sleeves need breadth, therefore set-in sleeves, put well on the outward edge of the shoulders will give an appearance of width. Puffed sleeves and those with fullness at the shoulder are also good.
Q. Do you recommend tar shampoo for blonde hair?
A. No; this is best only for dark hair.

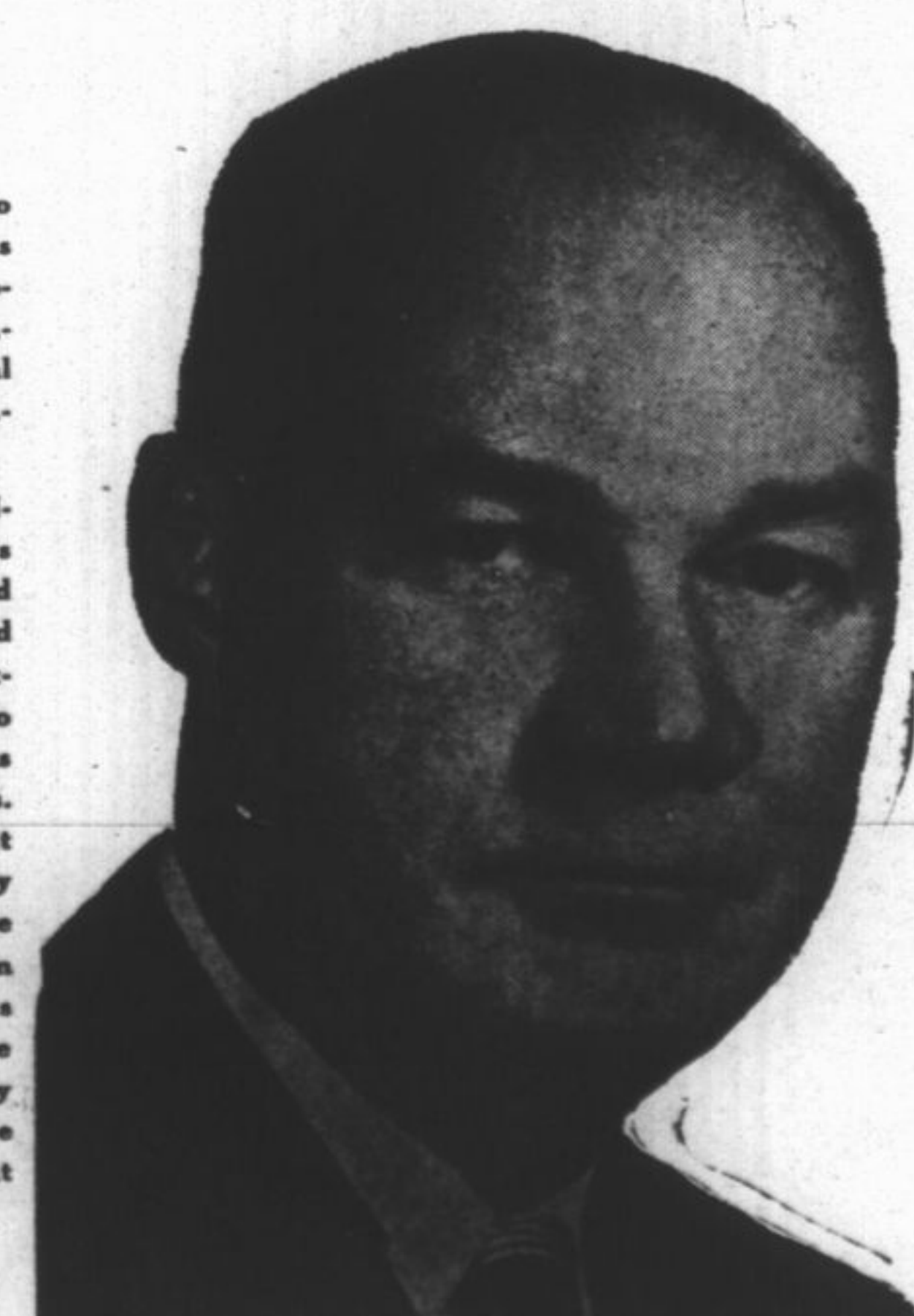

DURING HIS TIME IN OFFICE YOUR PRESENT STATE'S ATTORNEY HAS CONDUCTED THE AFFAIRS OF THE OFFICE IN ALL ITS VARIOUS ASPECTS AS FOLLOWS:



During the same period also the State's Attorney's Office has collected delinquent personal property taxes in the amount of \$249,922.74 and delinquent general taxes in the amount of \$1,258,471.10.

ENFORCEMENT OF CRIMINAL LAWS: 399 indictments have been returned by the Grand Jury and in 16 cases the Grand Jury has refused to vote indictments in matters presented to them. In 91 cases probation has been granted to first offenders. Of this total of 91 probations it has been necessary to revoke only 8. A total of 161 offenders have been sent to the State Penal Farm at Vandalia, 67 to the Illinois State Penitentiary, 126 to the County Jail, 6 to the Security Hospital at Menard, and 6 to the State Reformatory for Women at Dwight.

Among juveniles and lesser offenders 780 criminal cases were presented. In addition to this, the State's Attorney has assisted the County Court in its routine handling of welfare problems, which has involved 519 cases concerning dependent families, 828 cases of mental illness, 125 cases of feeble-mindedness, and 26 cases of epilepsy.

In addition to these, there have been the routine duties of prosecuting for misdemeanors and lesser offenses. This has involved the filing of 497 Informations in County Court. 231 of these have resulted in probations, which were successfully completed without repetition of any offenses. In only 8 cases has it been necessary to revoke probations in County Court. 283 delinquency petitions were filed.

Among the prosecutions which have been successfully conducted by this office have been several cases of murder and manslaughter and other major crimes. Two men have been sentenced to 30 years in the State penitentiary for murder and four others have been sent to penitentiaries for terms of from 5 to 14 years for manslaughter or similar offenses. Sexual offenders have been given sentences ranging from one to 10 years in the State penitentiary to 50 years in the State penitentiary. Convictions for robbery, larceny and confidence game in the case of defendants who have previously committed offenses have resulted in sentences ranging from 3 to 10 years in the State penitentiary.

In addition to all of these duties the State's Attorney's Office has of course interviewed approximately 15,000 new complainants and persons seeking information, has served as legal adviser without charge for almost a hundred taxing bodies, smaller governmental bodies and groups of interested citizens. He has represented the County of Lake in the Appellate and Supreme Courts in all cases.
