AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 223 OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK CODE OF 1919, BEING AN AMENDMENT AND REVISION OF SECTION 9 OF CHAPTER XII (REGULATING AND SUPERVISING PROFESSIONS) OF AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 223 OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK CODE OF 1919, BEING AN AMENDMENT AND REVISION OF SECTION 9 OF CHAPT. XII" PASSED FEBRUARY 16, 1948, APPROVED FEBRUARY 17, 1948 AND "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 223 OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK CODE OF 1919, BEING AN AMENDMENT AND REVISION OF SECTION IX OF CHAPTER 12, PASSED FEBRUARY 18, 1948, APPROVED FEBRUARY 19, 1948, PASSED APRIL 25, 1948, APPROVED APRIL 26, 1948.)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I: That Section 223 of the City of Highland Park Code of 1919, as amended, and being Section 9 of Chapter XII of the City Code, be and the same is hereby amended and, as amended shall be as follows:

323. FEES. 9. That the owner of each such wagon or motor vehicle shall pay an annual license fee in the manner as provided in Section 222 hereof of the City of Highland Park in the amounts as follows:

- A. Horse drawn vehicles:
One horse wagon or vehicle \$2.00
Two horse wagon or vehicle 3.00
Three horse wagon or vehicle 6.00
Four horse wagon or vehicle 12.00
Six horse wagon or vehicle 12.00
- B. Motor driven vehicles:
Motor bicycle, motorcycle or motor tricycle of thirty-five horse power or less. Two Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$2.50).

Automobiles and motor vehicles of thirty-five horse power or less, for transportation of persons, exclusive of trucks, coaches, omnibuses and motor vehicles used for commercial purposes. Ten Dollars (\$10.00).

Motor vehicles having a gross weight of three thousand (3,000) pounds or less, including the weight of the vehicle and maximum load, or tractors with one semi-trailer having a combined gross weight of three thousand (3,000) pounds or less, including the weight of the tractor, trailer and maximum load, twenty dollars (\$20.00).

Motor vehicles of more than three thousand (3,000) pounds and not more than eight thousand (8,000) pounds, including the weight of the vehicle and maximum load, or tractors with one semi-trailer having a combined weight of more than three thousand (3,000) pounds and not more than eight thousand (8,000) pounds, including the weight of the vehicle and maximum load, twelve Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$12.50).

Motor vehicles of more than eight thousand (8,000) pounds and not more than twelve thousand (12,000) pounds, including the weight of the vehicle and maximum load, or tractors with one semi-trailer having a combined gross weight of more than eight thousand (8,000) pounds and not more than twelve thousand (12,000) pounds, including the weight of the tractor, trailer and maximum load, twenty dollars (\$20.00).

Motor vehicles and tractors with one semi-trailer each having a gross weight of over twelve thousand (12,000) pounds, including the weight of the vehicle and maximum load, thirty-five dollars (\$35.00).

Tractors, traction engines or other similar vehicles used for hauling purposes, except as otherwise provided by this ordinance shall pay license fee according to their weight as hereinbefore required.

C. Trailers: Motor vehicles used with trailers for purposes of hauling other than persons shall pay to the City for each calendar year, additional license fees for the use of the City streets at the following rates:

- Where hauling trailers having a gross weight of 2,000 pounds and less, including the weight of the trailer, and maximum load, \$2.50.
- Where hauling trailers having a gross weight of more than 2,000 pounds and not more than 5,000 pounds, including the weight of the trailer and maximum load, \$5.00.
- Where hauling trailers having a gross weight of more than 5,000 pounds and not more than 10,000 pounds, including the weight of the trailer and maximum load, \$10.00.
- Where hauling trailers having a gross weight of over 10,000 pounds, including the weight of the trailer and maximum load, \$17.50.

D. All such licenses shall expire on the 31st day of December following the date of issue, and the first issue of a license for each wagon, or motor vehicle shall be reduced fifty (50) percent if purchased during the second half of the calendar year, but in no case shall there be a re-issuance of a license for any previously licensed vehicle or trailer for a less sum than is hereby required for a calendar year.

SECTION II: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed. The provisions of AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 223 OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK CODE OF 1919, BEING AN AMENDMENT AND REVISION OF SECTION 9 OF CHAPTER XII, PASSED FEBRUARY 16, 1948, APPROVED FEBRUARY 17, 1948 AND "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 223 OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK CODE OF 1919, BEING AN AMENDMENT AND REVISION OF SECTION IX OF CHAPTER 12, PASSED FEBRUARY 18, 1948, APPROVED FEBRUARY 19, 1948, PASSED APRIL 25, 1948, APPROVED APRIL 26, 1948," are hereby expressly repealed.

SECTION III: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, recording and publication, provided however that the license fees fixed and provided for herein shall become effective and payable upon January 1, 1949 for such calendar year and upon the 1st day of January in succeeding years.

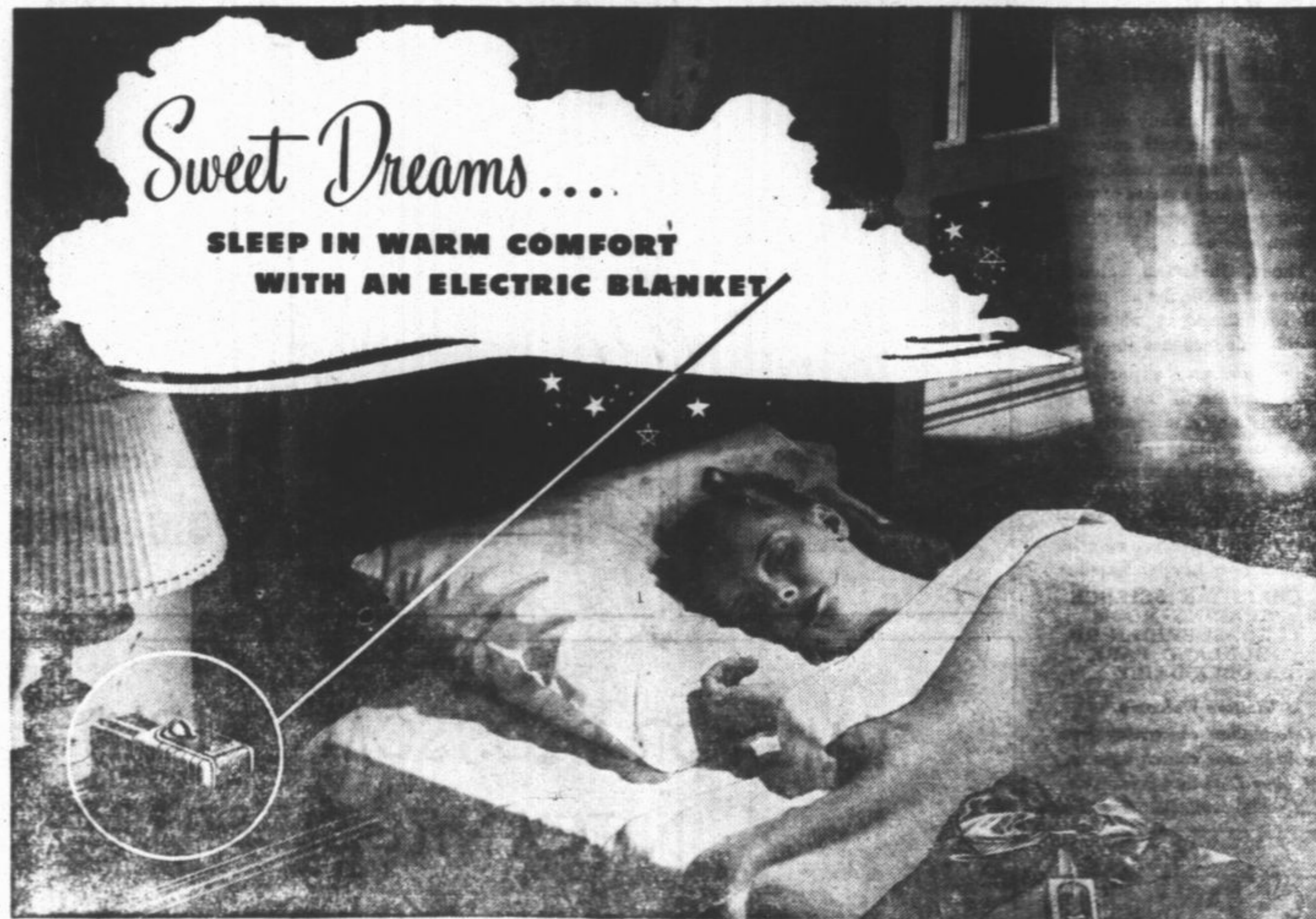
