A PROTEIN-PACKED HEARTY DINNER DISH

- FISH A LA MODE**
- 1 1/2 cups cooked fish filets, coarsely flaked
 - 2 tbs. shortening
 - 2 tbs. flour
 - 1 cup milk
 - 1/2 cup grated cheese
 - Salt and pepper
 - 1/4 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
 - 1 cup sliced celery
 - 2 tbs. chopped parsley
 - 1 tsp. grated onion
 - 1 tbs. shortening

Make a white sauce of 3 tbs. shortening, flour, and milk. Season with salt, pepper, and Worcestershire sauce; add grated cheese. Sauté celery, parsley, and onion in 1 tbs. of shortening until celery is lightly browned. Fold into white sauce. Fold in the fish, being careful not to mash it. Serve hot over biscuits, toast, or mashed potato. Serves 4 to 6.
