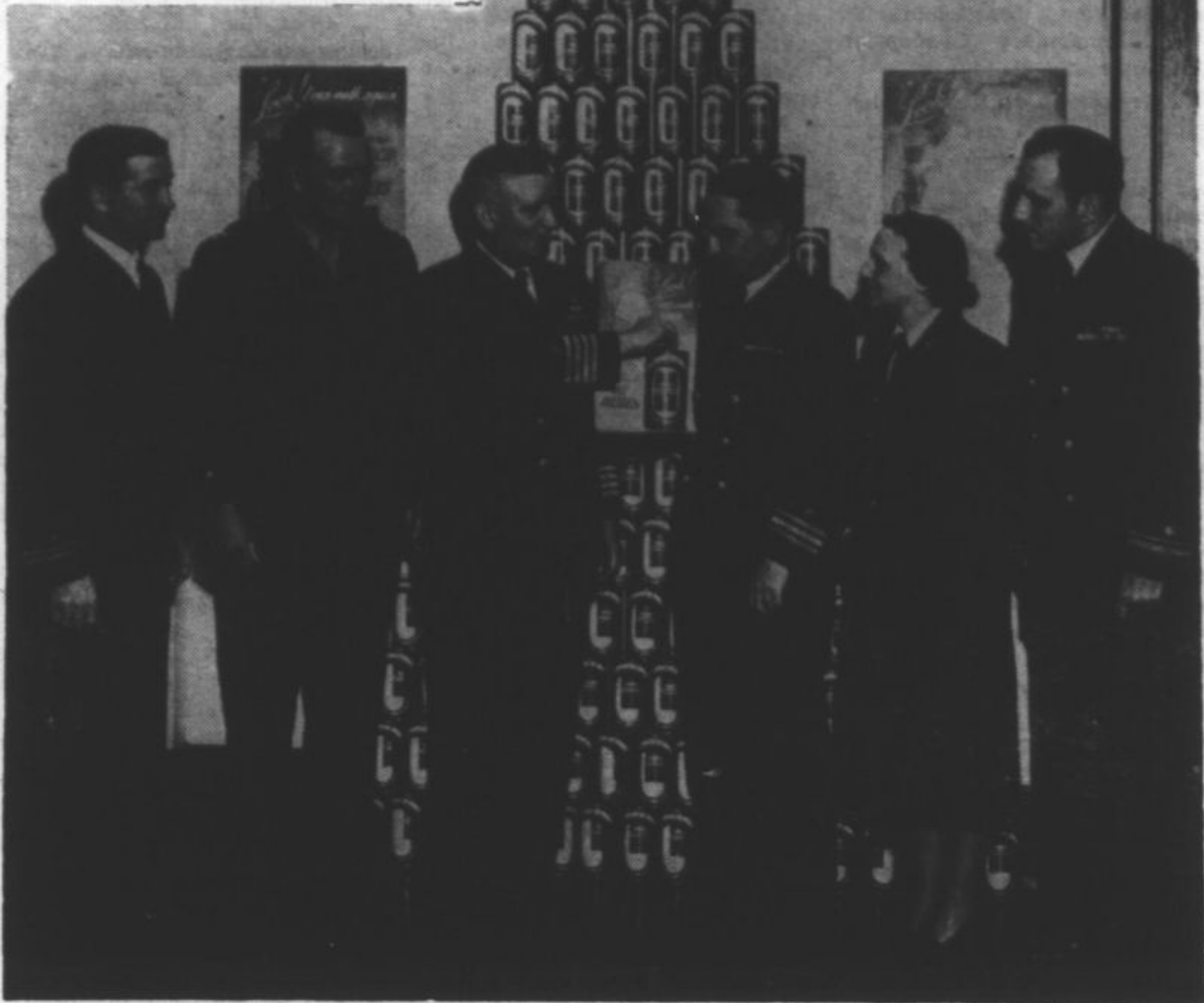

Income Tax A Headache? Library Offers Pointers

Those dreaded income tax computations can be simpler this year thanks to the two new tax guides now at the Highland Park Public Library. The United States Treasury Department has printed Year Federal Income Tax, an exhaustive manual answering the numerous questions which come to mind. Also available is the last edition of J. K. Lasser's Income Tax, with its step-by-step explanations and lists of errors frequently made in tax returns.

These booklets can save time, penalties and future assessments by pointing out pitfalls to avoid, and may be well worth a special trip to the library. The federal bulletin will be kept at the main desk and will always be available for use in the library, while the Lasser guide may be charged out for a period of seven days.
