Glamour and babies will be synonymous for four weeks as volunteer committee workers concentrate on enrolling 1,000 new members to help in the financial support of the Maternity Center.

For fifty-four years the Chicago Maternity Center has served Chicago's needy mothers, delivering their babies with the safe obstetrical technique handed down by its founder, the late Dr. Joseph B. De Lee. Equaling this service to mothers is the Center's teaching program. Doctors and medical students from every state in the Union and eighteen foreign countries have visited the Center to study its home delivery technique.

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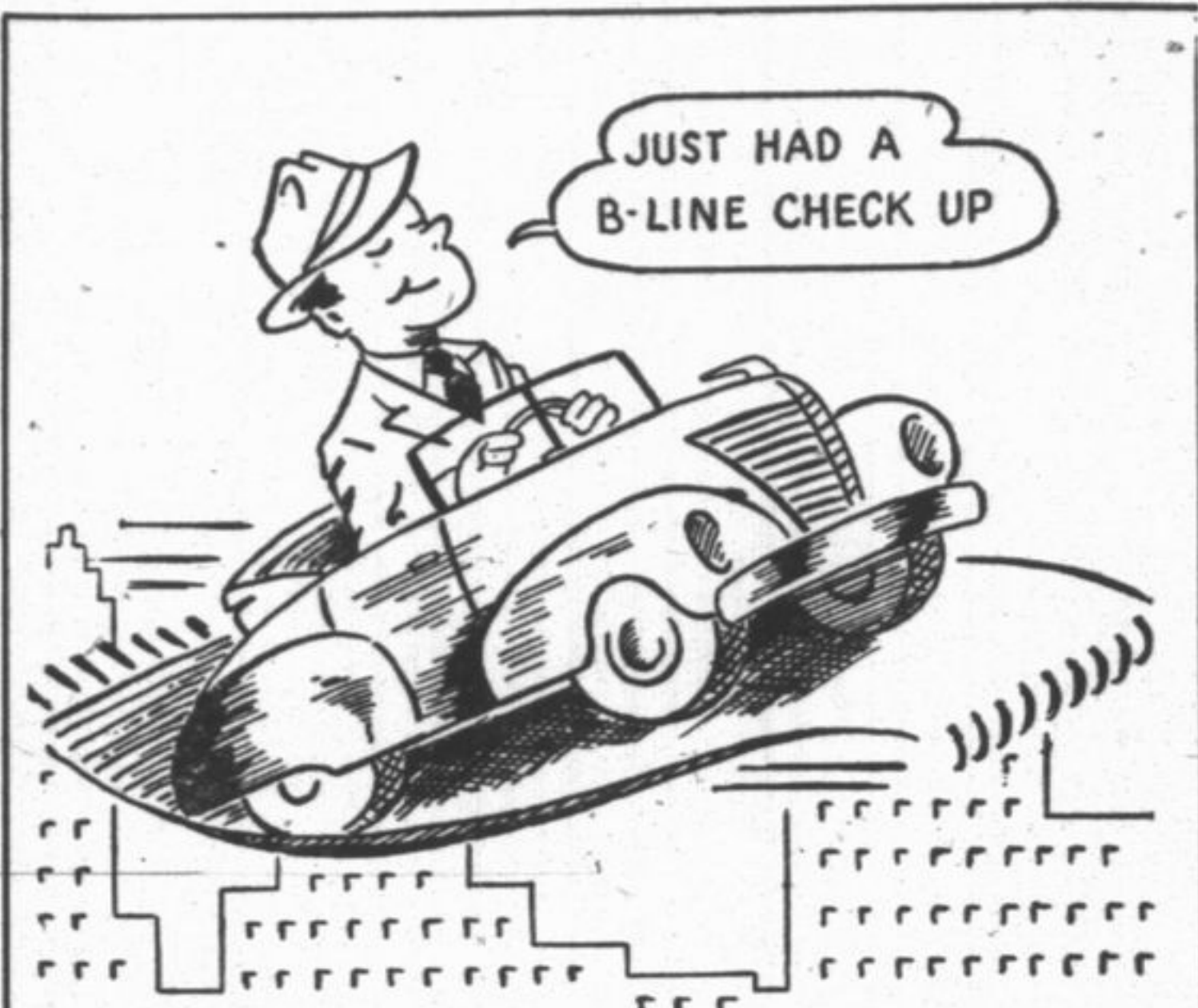
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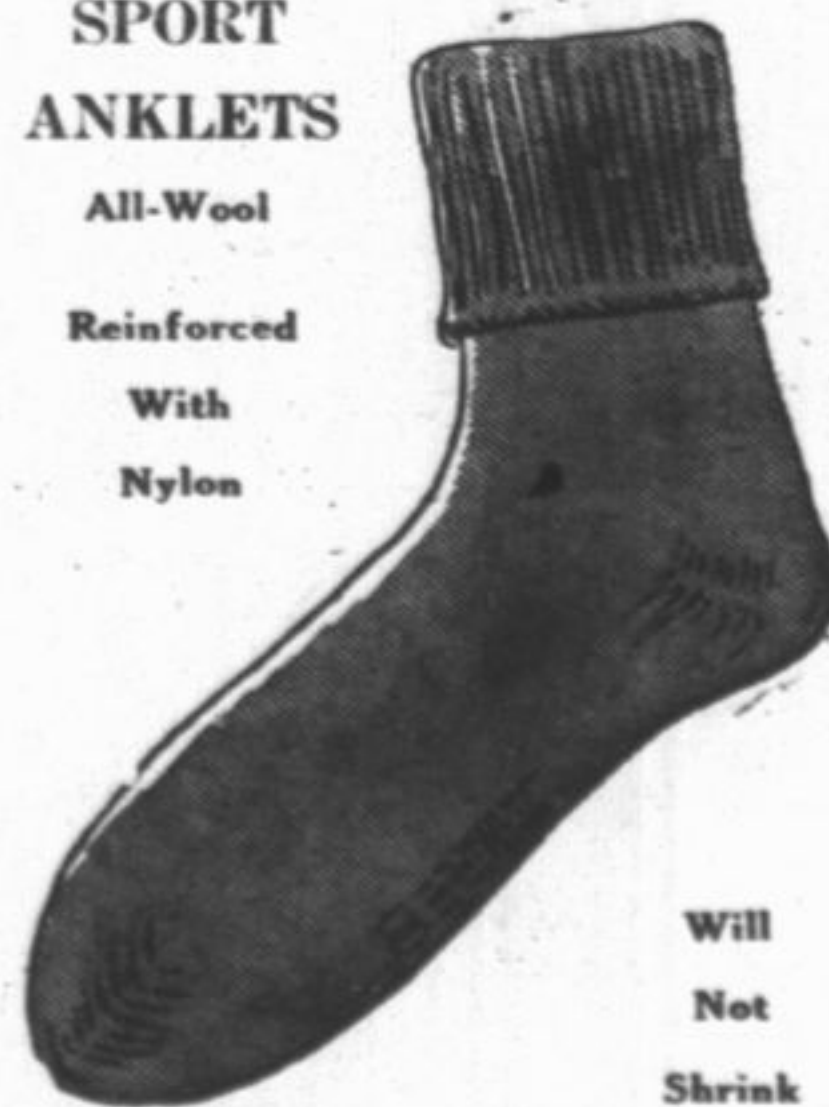
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
