## Little Giant Frosh-Soph Trip Oak Park 35 to 28; Evanston Next Foe

The Highland Park high school Frosh-Soph cagers broke into the win column again last Friday as they took a 35-28 contest from Oak Park in a Suburban conference game played on the Oak Park floor.

Coach Dorman Morrison started four freshmen and a sophomore in an effort to get a little height on his team. With Marchietti and George playing their first game as full fledged starters teamed with Frank and Dante Picchiatti and Moore the Blue and White did not look too good in the first quarter as they were behind 5-2 as the second quarter started.

Then, showing the best defensive work and rebounding of the year, the Highland Park boys turned on the heat to leave the floor at half time with the score 13-9 in their favor.

The score at the start of the last quarter was 24-16 and the Blue and White kept right on to win 35-28.

### Was Real Team Victory

Although this was a real team victory the work of Marchietti and George should not go unmentioned. Both boys were taking the rebounds and also did their share of the scoring.

D. Picchiatti was high point man of the game with 13 points. Marchietti had 6 points, George had 4 points, F. Picchiatti had 4 points, Moore had 5 points and Baldwin had 3 points to make up the scoring for the Blue and White.

When the points were added up last Saturday afternoon at the Proviso pool, New Trier was on top in the 1949 Suburban league swimming meet with 53 points. The "Terrier" mermen got their toughest competition from the Proviso swimmers, who captured 34 points in the memorable festivities. Highland Park ended up in a tie for fifth place with Thornton.

The "Little Giant" medley relay team, consisting of Block, McCullough, and Morrison, managed to garner fourth place, while the 200-yd. crawl relay team, consisting of Block, Engold, Kahn, and Peterson, gathered in fifth place honors. Roger Morrison, the only Highland Parker to capture an individual award, came in fifth in the 100-yd. breaststroke.

Four records fell in the torrid competition. Buddy Wallens set a startling 200-yd. freestyle time of 2:02.1 in the Friday afternoon preliminaries. The time not only established a Suburban league record but also smashed the national high school mark.

Another great performance was turned in by Bob Kivland for the 100-yd. breaststroke. The time, 1:03.4, broke a 13-year-old mark. Jerry Holan, of Proviso, hung up a 100 yd. breaststroke time of 1:05.3 to smash another league record.

New Trier's medley relay team, consisting of Kivland, Wallen, and Kroeschell, added the final touch to a great meet with a record time of 1:23.7.

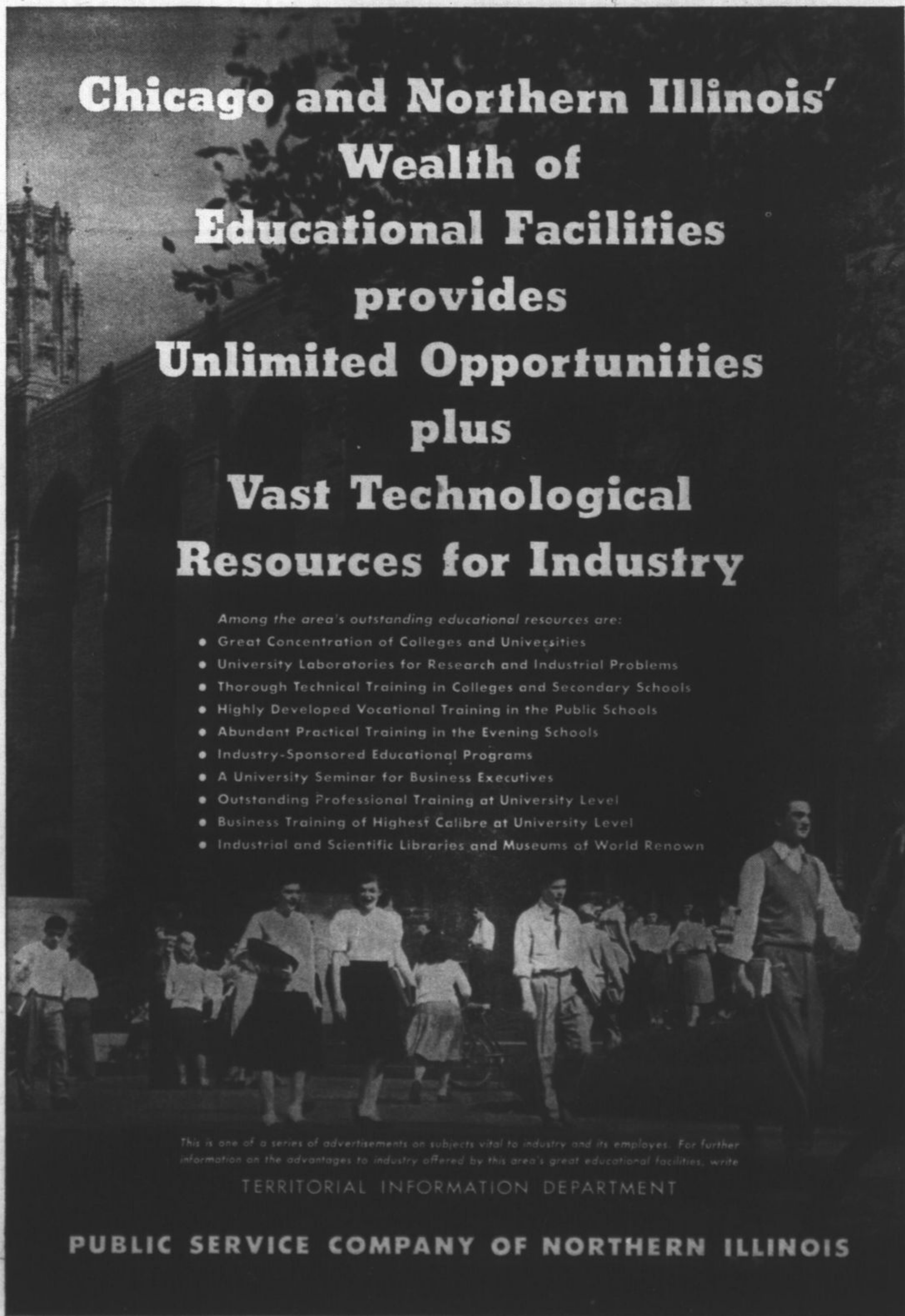
