Sixth grade:-Use of squares and planes, saws-rip, cross and mitre, spoke shaves, augur bits, braces, clamps, screw drivers, gouges, chisels etc. Cribbage and checker boards, waste baskets, cradles, garden decorative wheelbarrows, flower and seed boxes, snow shovels, sleds, albums, picture books, table lamps and cutting boards. The use of power tools in elementary school education is discouraged by Mr. Borg. He favors mixed classes and handicrafts for both boys and

Seventh Grade:-Intensive work in type setting lock-up and printing. Press work, printing of PTA year books, play programs, graduation programs and tickets, silk ribbon awards, miscellaneous office stationery and Christmas greeting cards. Two-color work in plastics and leather. Letter openers, mixing sticks, novelty boxes, letter holders, rings, bracelets, and other projects. Use of mototool, grinder and magnetic jig saw. Many articles in leather craft

Eighth grade: Course in household mechanics with related projects. Repairing and finishing of furniture; metal work, glass cutting; some electrical work; replacing of 'awcets, Mechanical drawing, lettering, lining etc.

There is considerable flexibility these courses as outlined. Ability of the child is taken into consideration, regardless of grade placement, and creative work is encouraged. At Christmas time a Christmas Toy shop is held after
