### LEGAL

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE CREATING A TRAFFIC COMMISSION AND ESTABLISHING TRAFFIC REGULATIONS FOR THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, PASSED AND APPROVED MARCH 10, 1941" (ADDING SECTION 79-D TO SAID ORDINANCE AND ADDING SCHEDULE XI THERETO). BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:**

**SECTION I.** That an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Creating a Traffic Commission and Establishing Traffic Regulations for the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, Passed and Approved March 10, 1941" be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto the following subsection, which shall be hereinafter known and cited as Section 79-D of said ordinance and, further, by the addition to said ordinance of a schedule which is hereby made a part thereof and shall be hereafter known, referred to and cited as Schedule 11 annexed to and made a part of said ordinance.

**Section 79-D.** The certain street intersections which are hereafter described in Schedule 11 attached to and made a part of this ordinance or which may be hereafter included in said Schedule 11 are hereby declared to be stop intersections for the purposes of this ordinance for and during the period from eight A.M. to four P.M. upon Monday through Friday of each and every week, excepting legal holidays and vacation periods during which the public or private schools within the City of Highland Park and in the vicinity of such intersections are not in session. When stop signs shall be erected at the entrance to any such stop intersection, every driver of a vehicle shall stop at every such stop sign before entering such intersection, except when directed to proceed by a police officer or traffic control signal.

**Schedule 11. Stop Intersections.** Through vehicular traffic to stop when signs erected:

Green Bay Road at its intersection with Elm Place proceeding either north or south. Green Bay Road at its intersection with Deerfield Avenue proceeding either north or south.

Green Bay Road at its intersection with Bobolink Road when proceeding south.

Green Bay Road at its intersection with Lincoln Avenue when proceeding north.

Green Bay Road at its intersection with Marion Avenue when proceeding either north or south.

Roger Williams Avenue at its intersection with Dean Avenue proceeding either east or west.

**SECTION II.** This amending ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, recording and publication, as required by law.
