Upsets Feature Basketball Tourneys

It seems that an unusual number of upsets were pulled in the State Basketball tournaments this year with Illinois probably seeing the most startling of them all.

Elgin, who had been picked as long ago as March, 1948 to win the 1949 championship, went by the boards in their first try as the "Sweet Sixteen" contests got underway at Champaign. They dropped a 45-42 thriller to an inspired Aurora West quintet.

In Michigan, Central high of Kalamazoo upset Arthur Hill of Saginaw to capture the class "A" crown and this team could do no better than finish fourth in the Southwestern Michigan league in the season's regular play.

Probably the closest and most unexpected winner of a State crown came when little Jasper (about 275) students) took a 62-61 contest from Madison in the Indiana finals. This was the first State crown for the Jasper high cagers in its history and the town itself boasts of only 5,000 population. So even in the "red hot" basketball state of Indiana the size of the school had little to do with the outcome of the State championship.

This should serve as a tonic for Highland Park folks who are content to sit back and blame the size of the high school for the lack of winning teams in the Suburban league. It should serve notice, more than ever that if the grade schools will get together and have school teams and possibly a Highland Park grade school tournament at the end of the season, Highland Park could well come off the bottom (or near the bottom, as you wish) and be a strong contender for the Suburban title, and who knows, they may even get "down state".

By the way, the Illinois State champions are the cagers from Mt. Vernon who defeated Hillsboro 45-39 for the title. It is their first crown since 1920.
