### Obituaries

#### Davidson

Word was received last week from Tampa, Florida, of the death of Miss Alice Davidson, daughter of the late Colonel Harlan P. and Mrs. Adelaide Davidson, founders of the Northwestern Military Academy, and sister of the late Colonel Royal Davidson, who carried on his father's school a few years ago.

The Davidson family came to Highland Park in 1888, where the Military Academy was established on the corner of Ravine drive and St. Johns avenue. After it was demolished by fire in 1915, it was not rebuilt, but moved to Lake Geneva, Wisconsin, where it has been known as the North Western Military and Naval Academy.

Many old timers of Highland Park will remember this fine Christian family whose "boys" marched to the Highland Park Presbyterian church every Sunday morning for worship with the congregation.

Alice S. Davidson was 81 years of age last August. She had made her home for many years in Avon Park, Florida. Burial was made in the family lot in New Haven, Connecticut.

#### Johnson

Last rites were conducted today (Thursday) at the Kelley & Spalding chapel, for C. Alfred Johnson, 1757 So. Green Bay road, who passed away last Monday at the Highland Park hospital at the age of 78, after a long illness.

Born in Sweden, he came to this country in 1888, and lived for a time in Chicago. He had been a resident of Highland Park for 25 years, and was affiliated with the John Ericson lodge, No. 361, IOOF, and the carpenters' union, local 141.

Surviving are his widow, Selma; a daughter, Vernon, of Highland Park; a brother, Frank Andren, and a sister, Mrs. Tilda Westin, both of Chicago.

Interment was made at Memorial Park cemetery.

#### McCann

Rites were conducted at Ft. Collins, Colorado, on Monday of this week for Roud McCann, 1515 Westview road, Highland Park, who succumbed on the preceding Thursday to an illness of one month at his home.

He was 61 years of age. He had served as director of the American Dry Milk Institute, Inc., of Chicago, for the past 20 years.

A native of Madison, Kansas,

he received his B.S. degree from Colorado State college in 1914, and his M.A. degree from Northwestern university in 1928. First employed as secretary and director of the Colorado Creamery Butter Manufacturers association, he later worked with the National Dairy council, and was director of extension of Colorado State college from 1921 to 1929.

He is survived by his widow, Dorothy; his mother, Mrs. Emma McCann of Fort Collins, Colorado; one son, Jordan, of Orinda, California, and a grandson, James Scott McCann.

### Local Youth Meets Fatal Accident

A shocking accident occurred early this morning (Thursday) when 19-year-old J. Twain Turner, son of Mr. and Mrs. Oliver S. Turner, 289 Park avenue, met his death in an automobile accident. With him were four young friends, one of whom, a Mr. Coulter of Glenview, was also killed.

The accident occurred on Green Bay road, north of Lake Forest, when the car missed a turn and crashed into a tree.

Young Turner, a freshman at Kenyon college, Ohio, was one of the students who escaped death during the burning of the dormitory building in which his fraternity was housed. He is a graduate of Highland Park High school.

Surviving are his parents, a brother, Stansfield now a Rhodes scholar at Oxford university, England, and his maternal grandmother, Mrs. W. E. Wagner of Chicago.
