Marmalade

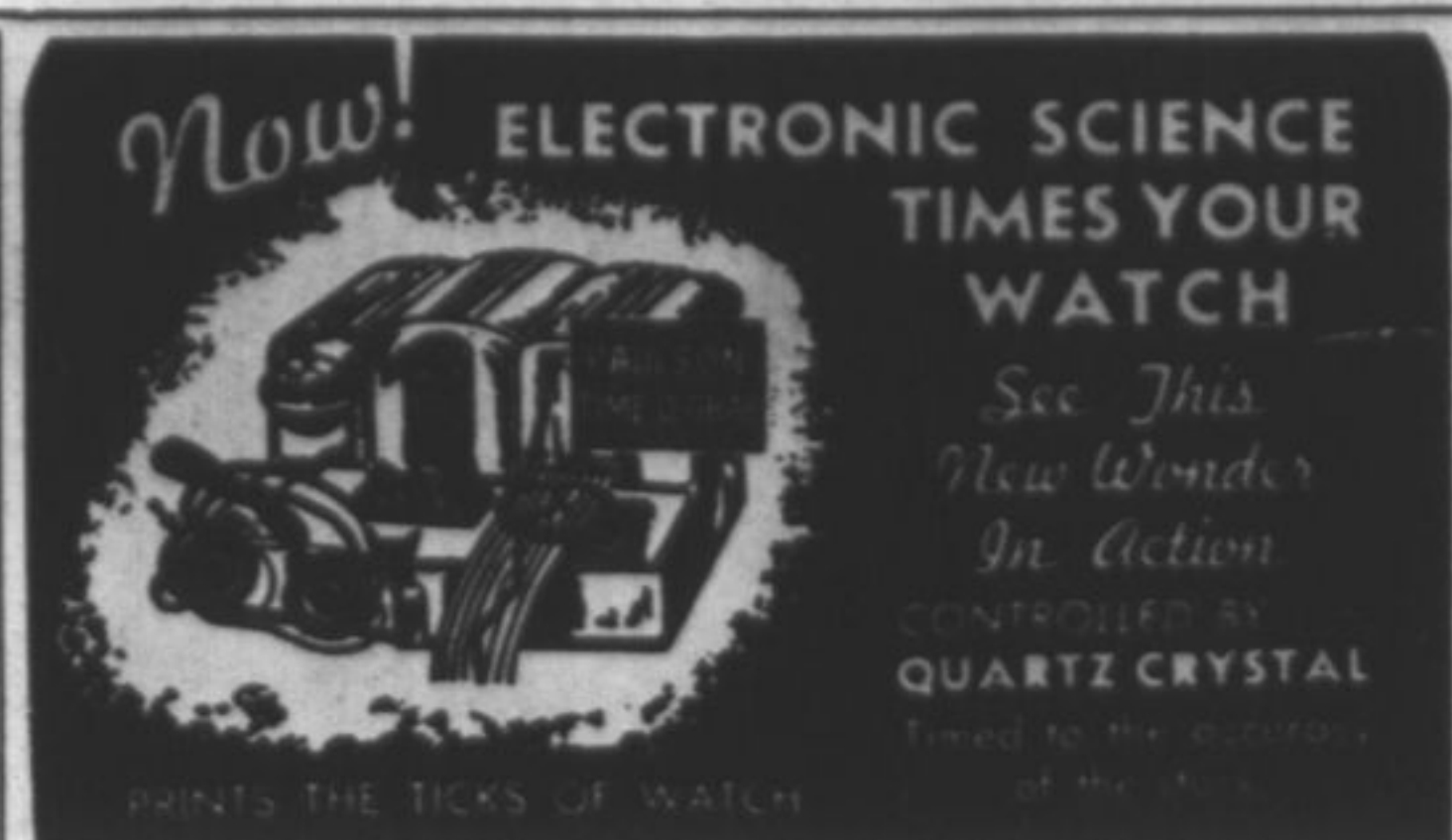
