After spending three years in Germany, Lt. and Mrs. James F. Garrington (Margaret Eitner) returned home last week.

Concerning the Garringtons, the Roving Reporter of "The Thomas H. Barry" News has this to say:

"Lt. James F. Garrington, who has completed 215 flights in the Berlin Air Lift, told this reporter that he leads rather a dull life, nothing of any news value. His fellow pilots, however, say that Garrington flew one of the first planes in after the blockade began and that he has continued to fly steadily, usually piloting C-54s. Among his trophies are the Air Lift Medal and honorary membership in the Chimney Sweep Club, German organization, which presented to outstanding Air Lift pilots cigarette lighters decorated with a figure of a chimney sweep, emblem of good luck. Asked about the part a pilot's wife played in the Air Lift, as she was a Lift 'Widow', Mrs. Garrington replied, 'The greatest inconvenience was in having meals at odd hours,' but added cheerfully, 'If I had to have breakfast at 3 a.m., at least we could have eggs the way we wanted them cooked.' The Garringtons, after two years at Tempelhof in Berlin and one at Rhine-Main in Frankfurt, are going to Smoky Hill AF Base in Salina, Kansas."

After a few days here with Mrs. Garrington's parents, the Henry C. Eitners of 1310 Pleasant avenue, they left for Ottumwa, Iowa, for a two weeks' visit with Lt. Garrington's parents. They plan to return to Highland Park for another visit before they go on to their new station in Kansas.

Cancer Fund Returns

With only \$1,252.12 remaining to be raised in the 1949 cancer fund drive, Lake county reached the 95 per cent mark last week. Total collections were \$22,547.88 while the quota is \$23,800.
