Siegel's Relief Hurling Helps Harrison's Whip Tower Casino 11 to 10

Harrison Wholesale's 12 inch team overcame a three run deficit in the last inning, with timely hitting and some fine relief pitching to top the Tower Casino, 11-10 in a non-league tilt at the Highland Park high school field, last Thursday night.

For the fourth game in a row, the Harrison outfit spotted the other team some runs in the first inning. In this case the number being four, on five hits, and some poor infield play. But as usual, Harrison roared back in the following innings with two in the first, three in the second, two in the third, and four more in the seventh inning.

Tom Murphy, Harrison's ace was knocked out of the box in the fifth inning as a walk, two errors and two hits got him in some very hot water. Joel Siegel, in his first appearance as a relief pitcher, calmly retired the side, and for the next three innings gave up only two hits, and one unearned run to receive credit for the victory.

Pitching for the Casino was Harry Lane, ex-shortstop who is considering going back to that position after a shakey exhibition. Harry's fence clearing home run to right field, with two men on board (which was one of the best hit balls to be seen on that diamond) momentarily tied up the

game in the fourth inning.

As the last half of the seventh rolled around Harrison was three runs down, when they suddenly came to life and showed why they're one of the most respected teams in their class when it comes to concentrated power in the clutch. DeBartolo led off with a single, Marion Fiore doubled with DeBartolo scoring. Weil took a walk, and Arenberg singled, scoring Fiore, to make the score 10-9.

Pinch batter Bob Fiore, out of action for the past week with a bad knee drove a long fly to left field scoring Weil, and on a bad throw to the infield, Arenberg crossed home plate with the winning run, to hand the Casino outfit, their first defeat of the season with a record of three and one.
